Fr. Tomaszis Weekly Reflection

On the solemnity of the Assumption of the Blessed Mother, we look intently at Mary, the Mother of God, in the last moments of her earthly presence. Traditional depictions imagine her body lifted up by angels in a radiant light. Today's celebration makes us aware of the goal of our earthly journey, which Mary had already achieved when she was taken body and soul into heaven. The passage from the Book of Revelation we hear today: a woman clothed with the sun, with the moon under her feet, and on her head a crown of twelve stars, shows Mary in her heavenly glory, seated next to her Son in his Kingdom. We believe that this divine inheritance will also be shared by us, redeemed by the precious Blood of Christ and called to the life of heaven.

The road to the heavenly homeland leads along the paths of our earthly life. It is on one hand about avoiding sin and on the other, living in a state of grace. Our devotion to Mary, our veneration, each of our Hail Marys, reminds us of what our greatest treasure is - the state of sanctifying grace, union with God through his Son, our Lord, Jesus Christ.

Mary, herself fully saved and raised to heaven, not only precedes the pilgrim Church, but constantly supports her on the way to the ultimate fullness of the Kingdom, when God will be everything in everyone. She demonstrates how to live with longing for heaven, longing for eternal happiness with God. She also teaches us to associate this longing with the tasks we undertake, so that we do not forget that earthly life is given to us as an opportunity to prepare ourselves for the fullness of eternal life. She encourages us to take up our daily duties just as she did: not separating what belongs strictly to God – prayers, Sacraments, Scriptures – from our everyday life. So that we may live with God, for Him and in Him, in every moment of our lives.

The Assumption is the culmination of all Marian celebrations of the liturgical year. It complements everything that the Church has recognized and revered in the person and life of Mary, from the earliest times. God gave Mary the privilege of the Immaculate Conception, thanks to which she was not subject to the law of death, which is the result of the original sin. And the body from which Christ took his human nature, God has kept from the contagion of sin. The Church reminds us today of the dogma of our faith, proclaimed in 1950 by Pope Pius XII, that "Mary, the Immaculate Mother of God, having completed the course of her earthly life, was taken body and soul into heavenly glory."

In today's Gospel we hear Mary's cousin, Elizabeth, bestow the gift of two blessings on Mary when she greets her. Elizabeth blesses Mary not only because she believes that Mary is the mother of the Lord, but also because she recognizes that Mary has complete faith in God's promise. When Elizabeth prophetically pronounces Mary "blessed among women" and proclaims that the fruit of Mary's womb is blessed, she uses the same term that Jesus uses to bless people in the Beatitudes. Good stewards recognize the Spirit-driven love and courage that inspired Elizabeth's hospitality toward a young, unmarried, pregnant woman and the honor Elizabeth bestowed upon Mary who would ordinarily be shamed for bearing this child. In what ways can we extend the blessings we receive in the Eucharistic celebration to others in order to honor them and offer them God's hospitality?
