





Fr. Tomasz's Weekly Reflection

In the era of research, surveys, popularity polls and ballots, it's clear that opinion plays a significant role in people's lives. It's reflected in various charts, graphs and tables.

As we read in today's Gospel passage Jesus and his disciples set out for the villages of Caesarea Philippi. Along the way he asked his disciples, "Who do people say that I am? It takes a while until Jesus asks the disciples of their own opinion, to which Peter responds You are the Christ. The apostles walked slowly towards such faith. There was a time when they asked themselves who is this man to whom even the wind and the sea obey? The time of uncertainty, however, is now over. Their faith has matured. Faith which is not just a human conviction, but a gift of grace.

In the kind of survey that appears in today's Gospel passage, we see that significant changes are taking place in Jesus' ministry. Until now, He has tried to hide his messianic identity, but now there is a difference: Jesus speaks of who He really is, but at the same time, along with the truth about his identity, He speaks bluntly about his coming passion, death and resurrection.

The Jews did not really know who Jesus was or what to make of Him. King Herod sees in Jesus John the Baptist, whom he ordered to be murdered. Others considered Jesus to be Elijah or one of the old prophets. However, the truth about Jesus Christ, the Messiah, the incarnate Word of the living God, eludes our guesses, expectation and imaginations.

Often our situation is similar to that of Jesus' disciples. We are with the Lord, we encounter Him in prayer, we try to live our best lives. However, when the fundamental and essential question is asked: "Who do you think Jesus is? Who is He for you?" We often cannot really answer it.

The question of the identity of Christ is inseparable from the question of our own identity. We often have problems finding an answer to the question of who we truly are. The closer we are to Jesus, the more we get to know His person, and the more we get to know Him, the more we begin to understand ourselves. We are unable to fully understand ourselves without Christ, and we do not comprehend Him without trying to answer the question of who we are.

Who is Jesus and His Gospel for me? Am I ready to accept it without reservation? For almost two thousand years, Jesus has been constantly asking, "Who am I for you?" He is not content to hear us quote the most learned answers or the most popular responses, because what matters to Jesus is our personal answer.
