Fr. Tomasz's Weekly Reflection

Humility is a quality which Jesus repeatedly put before the eyes of his disciples, just like He did with the child in today's Gospel. Humility is not the same as humiliation. It is an action of self-denial which shows us the truth about ourselves. It is an openness to the reality of our true insignificance. Just as the water in the mountains flows down into the valleys and does not go up the peaks, likewise God's grace is bestowed on those who put themselves at the right level.

Humble people do not look for anybody's attention. As if they weren't there, and as if they had no desires of their own, they constantly keep God's will in their hearts and on their minds. They are like mirrors that do not have an image of their own, but reflect the one who stands in front of them. Most Church Fathers believed that God created angels with the perfect humility, reflecting God's light for people, and representing Him as if in a mirror image. Humility brings one closer to God, while keeping the humble themselves almost invisible. That is why in the Bible, often when someone talks to an angel, it says in one place that he is talking to God, and some other time that he is talking to an angel, as if the angel was only visible for a moment and brought God closer to man with his whole being. Humble persons should assume the attitude similar to that of an angel. Being so humble that one cannot be seen, but all who look at him see God alone.

The original text, quoting Jesus' words about being last, uses the expression which means the last, but also the youngest, fresh, newest. And this is the key to understanding humility. The one who chooses to be the last, stands behind others, becomes someone new, fresh, someone eternally young. This child, placed by Jesus at the center of his disciples' attention, was the youngest, or in fact still young, never old. Man's humility makes him young and fresh. If we're bitter and decrepit, it is indicative that we need more humility in our lives.
