### Why You Need to Make Mealtime A Family Tradition

When was the last time you sat down with your daughter and family to share a meal without interruption? Chances are, it's been a while, considering the busy lives many of us lead. Between early school drop-offs and evening sprots practices, it can be challenging to eat a meal together.

The truth is, so much good comes from family meal time conversations. It's a low pressure way to go beyond the surface and get into your girl's heart and mind. What you learn from her can range from feelings of being left out of her friend group to her newfound love of Orca whales!

Make family mealtime a priority: a space to listen, learn, encourage, pray together, and open the floor for a great discussion.

## Fr. Tomasz's Weekly Reflection

These days there are many different people, organizations, institutions, calling us to action in the opposition to others, to stand against other groups, ideologies, political views. Many people hear those calls, but end up deceived by empty words and unfulfilled promises. Those come also from groups that wear Jesus' name on their lips, but have little to do with faith and Jesus Christ himself. It's is likely like that because the words can be twisted to fit a certain ideology, while their actual meaning is completely ignored.

It is good that we often read about the prophets, God's chosen ones, preaching the message spoken in the Name of the Lord. For when we read and hear about people selected by God to impart truth to us, we learn to recognize His message and are encouraged to implement it in our lives. But we also need to be cautious not to measure everyone equally. We have to learn to separate the grains in the words we hear from the chaff: the Good News from phrases that appear lofty, but do not lead us to God. In every word we hear we need to find the distinction between God's message of comfort and peace, and the things that have been used deliberately to wreak havoc on our minds. This principle applies not only to words, but also to people. The apparent goodness of some and the wisdom they proclaim can deceive us and lead us astray, because their intentions are not always sincere.

The question is whether and how we can recognize what comes truly from God and what is only a deception. In order to make that call Jesus teaches us that we need to heal our eyesight, our view of the world, of God, and of people. In the 21st Century most of us suffer from a kind of dependence on the television as our "eye on the world," but with time this view narrows down and soon ceases to be a window, but becomes a "peephole," distorting our view of reality.

For a Christian, the eye itself can no longer suffice as "the light of the flesh." Christ has given us the light of the Holy Spirit, which allows us a correct vision of reality every day. So we should not rely on our senses alone, but rather should try to look at everything through the prism of our own personal relationship with God, and always in the light of faith kept alight by the Holy Spirit.
