Fr. Tomosz's Weekly Reflection We tend to look for love more in ourselves than in God, and such a setting gives little hope for a lasting relationship. Sooner or later this love will exhaust itself and lead to an exposure to a temptation of looking for it somewhere else. Love, without access to the very source of love, God himself, after some time burns out, like a fire without a wood to burn. If in addition to that a couple is also engaging in premarital sex, the chances of a faithful relationship are even lower. Many times addressing it with engaged couples we hear in response that they have sex with each other because they love each other. This is a dangerous assumption and a slippery slope logic, because according to it, every time one falls in love with another person, it will only make sense to look for sexual relationship. One may fall in love with different people multiple times during a lifetime, but that does not mean that he or she has to have intercourse with every single person they are ever in love with. If one fails to hold back from sex in the premarital period, what is the guarantee that after marriage, he or she will remain faithful to their spouse, especially when they become attracted to another person?

Betrayal causes a great amount of pain and leads to an experience of the degradation of a person's dignity. Unfortunately, life without chastity is promoted pretty much everywhere, and - statistically - most couples practice premarital sex. But it only takes to trace the psychological effects on people cheated on, or analyze the situation of children from divorced relationships, so as not to underestimate the tragedy of a divorce. A divorce has depressing consequences on the life of children caught in the middle of it, in many cases preventing them from developing properly. Those growing up in the broken environment experience a permanent sense of threat and insecurity; they develop a perception of harm and guilt. The breakdown of the family causes most children to feel that they are unnecessary, worthless, unloved, and rejected, which in turn leads to depression. Parents who do not love each other anymore have nothing to offer to their children and leave them in an emotional vacuum that they cannot cope with.

Family falling apart is something unbearable, even the adults experience it discouragingly. A child experiences it as pain, which may lead to a state of despair, where the only conclusion is that somehow it's the child's fault that mother or father left. The child also feels betrayed and unworthy of love. This leads to the underestimation of self-worth and the belief that he or she does not deserve love and that experiencing love will never be possible again.

People who habitually indulge in adultery often drift away from faithfulness to God in other aspects of life. They not only hurt God, but also themselves and those they were supposed to love. On the other hand, those who rely on God's love tend to find hope even in most difficult circumstances, because their love knows no end, as it's not a human love, but Love Divine.

November 15th, 2021 in the Parish Hall In the Eastern Church, St. Andrew is known as the Protokletos ("First Called"), as John the Baptist invited him to follow Jesus. After doing so, Andrew then brought his brother Simon Peter to the Lord. (John 1:38-41) Similarly, it is not enough for priests to be satisfied with their own priestly vocations. Like Andrew, the

Lord is asking priests to bring others to Him so that they may discover their vocations as well.
