

Greatness is Found in Serving

In today's Gospel Jesus teaches his disciples that whoever wishes to be great among them must be a servant, just as he came to be a servant. Good stewards know that their "greatness" is found in God, and are affirmed by a serving heart, a Spirit-filled life, a humble walk and a commitment to acting in ways that glorify God. The "greatness" we feel about ourselves is rooted in a proper view of God in our lives and a proper view of our place in creation. It is from here that we derive our sense of identity and our belief that human life is particularly valuable. Not to be a servant of the Gospel and others would be poor stewardship. In what ways do we serve the Gospel in our daily lives?





Is Your Girl Motivated to Serve Others?

How many times have you been encouraged to join an organization, or volunteer with a non-profit because it will "look good on your resume?"

Good news: many of today's youth are less motivated by the notches on their resume, and more motivated by their internal drive and passions. The same may be true for your daughter.

Philippians tells believers not to serve selfishly, but to look to the needs of others. To cultivate a servant's heart within your girl, consider what my friend Tim Elmore calls "exposing rather than imposing."

Instead of imposing service requirements, expose your girl to the needs in your community. She may surprise you with the type of service project she's motivated to create as she looks to the needs of others.

Fr. Tomosz's Weekly Reflection We say that someone has friends in high places when they can do a lot for themselves thanks to knowing someone else. In the world of God, it is quite the opposite.

Jesus is a high priest, but also a suffering servant, crushed and tormented, bearing our iniquities, like a slave who follows the master with his luggage. God became a servant in the temporal world so that people would become masters of eternity. Anyone who wants to reign in eternity in this world must serve, offer sacrifices, bear the burdens of others on their backs, drink what others have "brewed." Whoever is somebody in this world will be nobody in the next. Jealousy, lust and the desire for honors drive a person out of this world. On the other hand, service is an honor in God's world. Yes, we do not feel exalted when we humble ourselves, serving God and people, because there is no reward in this world that is appropriate and fully gratifying. The world is too small to accommodate such a reward, so we are not having it here. Jesus' ministry reached its peak when He carried the cross. When He took the baggage of our sins on his back for us, ridiculed by those whose consciences He freed from guilt.

Many people would love to claim Jesus to be their friend in high places. This is how it works in our world: we desire to have friends at the highest positions, for our own benefit. However, in God's world, Jesus isn't there to help his friends, but rather his enemies. He has given them the best positions in heaven. Think for example about Saul when he persecuted Christians. Who did he become because of Jesus' scourged back?

The pinnacle of service is to give our lives as a ransom for others, and to die for those who try to destroy us. One can find such service in marriage, when their spouse's words pierce like swords, yet they still ask for their salvation with the words of intercessory prayers. We can find such service when we endure someone unpleasant, bringing our offering to God precisely in order to carry that person to Paradise on the back of our prayer. The most beautiful service is one that does not require gratitude from the person for whom the good was done.

Finally, I am not surprised that Jesus mentions the chalice in this context. This shows a connection with the mystery of the Eucharist. At every Mass, I pray to Jesus to unite me with him, in the consecrated Host. I also pray for those whose names He has written on my mind. This is my private prayer in spirit. Recently, I realized that He mostly puts on my mind those who have hurt me somehow. I felt relieved, even happy. They don't even know that I am praying for them, sometimes even more than for my loved ones. There is nothing that can give us a chance to love our enemies more than we love our friends than the Eucharist. This is what loving our neighbors is all about: being their connection in high places through our prayers and sacrifices offered for them. Not for our friends, but for our neighbors.
