Fr. Tomasz's Weekly Reflection

There are people who are honestly poor, but there are also those who pretend. Many times when a beggar is studying your face after stopping you on the street, he's trying to figure out only one thing: whether he will be able to get anything from you. They degrade, humiliate themselves, sometimes they invent incredible stories full of drama, forcing the drops of compassion out of our eyes and money out of our wallets. If they manage to awaken pity in us, they triumph, knowing their show has paid off. They look like actors receiving an Academy Award for best performance, because they made their audience sob.

It is a specific type of blindness, to live only to create an aura of pity, compassion and empathy around oneself. Living surrounded by others, jerking their tears, begging for their attention, demanding sympathy because of an imaginary tragedy they lied so much about that they already believe it's true. Perhaps this lifestyle is even more blind than being truly blind. There are people who are unable to talk well about themselves at all, because they are addicted to other's interests and compassion, constantly inventing new diseases or problems, presenting themselves as unfortunate victims, because thanks to this they gain the effect of pity in others. They live under the guise of well memorized but totally made-up stories about themselves, but their true self is hidden even from themselves.

We may have an identity known to ourselves and to others, or one that is unknown to us, but well known to others; then there is one that is known to us, but hidden from others, and finally an identity impenetrable both to us or to others. When Jesus healed Bartimaeus, He allowed him to throw aside his cloak, which was a symbolic cover hiding the truth. To see is first and foremost to be seen by God. Fear of being overlooked and forgotten by others can make us hide behind more and more fantastical masks that we put on, eventually becoming so secretive that we cannot even recognize ourselves anymore. This is the height of blindness.

The blind Bartimaeus, throwing aside his cloak, broke with this attitude of forcing pity on others, and took a risk of living his life in transparency. He stopped pretending, and Jesus healed him most completely. By asking him what he really wanted, Jesus forced Bartimaeus to define his disability. He did not simply tell him: you are blind. He wanted Bartimaeus to define himself. Jesus is aware that sometimes hearing the truth from someone else can make us even more fearful and more hidden, justifying ourselves or looking for arguments supporting us in our skewed position towards the world, God and ourselves. It is best for us to remove our own disguise by ourselves, because that puts us in the best position to break up with it for good.
