Jesus points out to his disciples the poor widow who has just dropped two simple copper coins into the temple treasury. He then delivers a teaching on stewardship. Despite her poverty, the poor widow in today's Gospel does not refuse God her generosity. Out of her desperately impoverished life she contributes to an earthly institution to give God glory and praise. It is not the monetary value of the gift that was important, but the love, trust and gratitude expressed through the gift. The Gospel asks us similarly compelling stewardship questions: What do we value? In what or whom do we place our trust? How do our own contributions to our community of faith reflect our generosity toward God?

Fr. Tomasz's Weekly Reflection

To give up the last penny is not only to give up on the desire to be in charge of our lives, but even more to let go of the illusion that we possess any kind of value on our own. In order to become priceless in God's eyes, we must shake off our illusions that we can do something without Him, or that we are better than others. Sometimes we have to get rid of the little we gave, to learn that renunciation is multiplication. The widow of Zarephath was not blessed with the abundance of flour and oil until she gave the last cake to Elijah.

But that same can be said about the spirit, whose arrogance manifests itself in the trust in our spiritual progress. God the Father said to St. Catherine of Siena: "Do you know daughter, who you are and who I am? If you know these two things you have beatitude in your grasp. You are she who is not, I AM HE WHO IS." The proud, because of their great desire to experience reverence and praise, often pretend to possess what they do not have: intellectual superiority, erudition, accomplishments, acquaintance with famous people, virtues of spirit and conscience, wealth, beauty, etc. On the contrary, those who are truly humble, for the sake of even greater humiliation, attribute to themselves faults that they do not have, so as not to receive the respect or recognition, which are more dangerous temptations than those of the flesh.

Two coins are really not much, but we have to give God even as little as that, remembering that in the parable of the talents, the third servant could not give up even one talent, although the others gave up five and two. Sometimes God gives us talents so that we can give glory to Him by renouncing them, which is something greater than gaining glory for ourselves by using them. Everything that is good in us belongs to God; we have nothing of ourselves and we are nothing. This is why we need to be vigilant, take care of every minute flaw, while they are still minute, lest they grow. Both holiness and sin begin with the little things which later lead to the greater: good or evil.

Once we are humbly deprived of everything, we will face the last temptation: admiration for our own humility. To desire praise for humility is a perversity and the destruction of humility. The widow from the Gospel reading and the one from Zarephath were both penniless. This is a turning point in their spiritual lives. Deprivation. Starvation. Jesus did the same by donating the last drop of blood for each of us. He also gave up his glory when He was judged and declared to be the worst blaspheme, possessed by Beelzebub. He did not fight for his reputation. As St. Thomas Kempis said: "Do not think that you have done good, if you do not consider yourself the worst of all."
