Fr. Tomasz's Weekly Reflection

The liturgy of the Word on the penultimate Sunday of the liturgical year directs our thoughts to the last days, to the second coming of Christ, *the Parousia*. This coming, unlike the first one, will be common and noticeable to absolutely everyone. However, the time of it is hidden, and—according to today's Gospel passage—only the heavenly Father knows when it will take place. Before it happens however, there will be signs which should be interpreted by the followers of Christ. This interpretation of the signs of the times is an important skill that gives a healthy, evangelical judgment of past, present and future reality. It also helps to inspire hope in the hearts of the faithful, preventing them from falling into pessimism or despair, and the state of a constant fear and uncertainty in the expectation of an inevitable doom.

The signs of the times are events through which God speaks to us. Therefore, it is important to trust in God, that through the creation of the world, and especially through the coming of His Son, Our Lord Jesus Christ, He entered the history of the world, making it in the same time the History of Salvation. Thanks to the help of the Holy Spirit, we can recognize the true signs of God's presence or His plans that are revealed to us in circumstances, events, and needs and desires of our hearts.

Faith in the second coming of the Son of Man makes the time of the Church one great period of expectation. What is certain is that *the Parousia* will be preceded by universal tribulation, various cataclysms and sufferings. Christ will return because, while the Father judges no one, He has entrusted all judgment to the Son. This judgment will be an act of deliverance of the humankind from the slavery to sin, to share in the freedom and glory of God's children. The Last Judgment will also be a recollection of our deeds, as the most credible testimony of our lives will be the mercy shown towards others. Finally, the judgment of the living and the dead will show the generosity of God's gift, the grace of the Kingdom prepared for us from the foundation of the world.

Christ, who in the Resurrection triumphed over sin and death, has shown us a glimpse of a new way of living with God. He has entered this life first, to prepare a place for his chosen ones. At the present time, Christians remain in the hope that one day they will live with God forever. Nobody knows when it will occur. It is therefore necessary to adhere to the words of Jesus, who calls us to use the time of God's grace fruitfully, by praying and keeping watch. In doing so we will always be ready to meet the Lord and filled with hope in His mercy.
