# Fr. Tomasz's Weekly Reflection

John the Baptist is the equivalent of a modern day superhero: a man extremely righteous and devoted to doing what is good, an athlete of prayer and a champion of fights with evil spirits. However, unlike any superhero, he prepares the crowds in modesty for the coming of a real Titan – Jesus Christ, the Messiah – a character for whom he is unworthy to untie the thong of a sandal. In other words, for all his nobility, he has no strength to redeem even one man from Satan's power. Even himself.

The symbolism of taking off or undoing sandals has its ancient tradition in the religious customs of Israel. There was a certain practice in Israel concerning the right to a woman whose husband had died, called the Levirate Law. Under this law a woman became legally the property of the next brother or next of kin. This rule was referenced by the Sadducees who approached Jesus making the question about the resurrection. However, someone else could redeem her, if the person to whom she belonged allowed himself to take off his sandal in public. This gesture meant letting someone else acquire the right to her. John, by saying that he cannot remove the sandals from Jesus' feet, implies that he is not entitled to the Bride, that is, the New Israel, belonging only to the Son of God.

Jewish mystics saw in this gesture a truth much deeper than just a passing of the right to a woman. In the same way as a sandal protects and carries a foot on a journey, the human body is a vessel that carries and protects a soul on the journey of life. To take off your sandal is to reveal yourself or to expose your spiritual identity. When Moses stood on Mount Horeb in front of God revealing himself to him in the burning bush, he heard from him saying that he should take off his sandals. Moses took off his sandals, and in the nakedness of his soul he saw the exposed or revealed Creator, who manifested his love for Israel with a sign of fire.

John humbly admits that he cannot do anything for God's love to be revealed in him. He is saying that Jesus' mission of the redemption of human kind is impossible to be passed on to anyone else. Only Jesus, the God incarnate, is entitled to the New Israel, only in Christ the revelation of God's mercy towards our sins can take place, only Jesus can rescue mankind from being captured by Satan. Using the same analogy to the Jewish law, when a man took off his sandal and handed it over to the other party in the Levirate ritual, he was relinquishing his right to the bride. The bride of Christ is the Church, but all of us, through our sins, have become captured by the Enemy, and therefore we need to be rescued, just as a woman had to be rescued by another man from being owned by a closest relative.

John reveals to his followers that he cannot save even himself, let alone be the Messiah of the people; he states that he also needs to be rescued, and that the only one who is capable of making it happen is coming, and is close indeed.
