

# Fr. Tomasz's Weekly Reflection

Mary set out and traveled to the hill country in haste to a town of Judah. Before Jesus learned to walk, before He spoke his first word, before He performed his first miracle, He was already carried to another person by his Mother. She made it possible for Him to reach and move John in Elizabeth's womb, before He was fully formed in her own womb. She responded to the mission that God gave her by becoming the first apostle. It remains like that till this day. As Luke points out, she did it all in haste, she didn't wait to do what she needed to do: the message of an angel moved her to not waste any time and to go immediately. This is why we turn to her so often in our prayers, because she never hesitates to bring them before her Son.

When Mary entered Elizabeth's house and greeted her, she did it in response to the greeting she heard from the angel in the moment of Annunciation. She acted exactly like the angel Gabriel. Her personal encounter with Gabriel made her act in the same way towards those she comes across, and to whom she brings Jesus.

Perhaps there is someone in our lives, like Elizabeth, who hopes for an encounter that will change their lives entirely. Elizabeth's attitude has changed noticeably after seeing Mary; she was filled with the Holy Spirit. To be filled is not to be empty inside. We were created by God to always experience this longing for fulfillment, until we are filled with God himself. When the Holy Spirit came upon Mary, she was filled with God's presence, with His overflowing Grace, and she couldn't keep it to herself. Her own satisfaction prompted her to go and fill others.

Many of us experience this impatience; we cannot wait for things to happen in our lives, we are frustrated because of the delayed train, bus or plane; Christmas or other celebration cannot come soon enough; the solution to many world problems is desperately expected. But how many of us rush to respond to God's call? St. Augustine is known for his expression: *O Lord, make me pure and holy: but not yet.* Mary doesn't fall for that temptation, and becomes holy and pure immediately. And she doesn't keep it to herself. The Holy Spirit allows her to accomplish it.

In this season of Advent we have been reminded about the most fundamental aspects of our relationship with God: He Created us, but we have been Captured by the Enemy; He Rescued us and He wants us to carry this message to others, just like Mary carried the Rescuer of human kind to Elizabeth. Each and every one of us baptized have been filled with the Holy Spirit, just like Mary was. So...What are we waiting for?
