

Fr. Tomasz's Weekly Reflection

At the beginning of the new calendar year, the Church honors Mary as the Holy Mother of God. Among her special privileges, Divine Motherhood must be mentioned first. The Mother of the Lord takes the highest and closest place after Christ precisely because of her motherhood. The truth about it was proclaimed a dogma at the Council of Ephesus in 431 AD. It was defined that it's not only fitting, but necessary to call Mary the Mother of God, *Theotokos*. It was also specified that Mary did not give Jesus his Divine nature, which He already had from the Father. She gave Christ the Lord his human nature – a human body. But because she gave it to the Divine Person of the Lord Jesus, she is therefore the Mother of the Son of God - according to the flesh and in time, just like Jesus is the Son of God - according to the nature of God and eternally.

Holy Mother of God made possible the incarnation of the Word of God, that is Jesus. No one, like Mary, knows the depth of the mystery of God made man. Everything in her life was shaped by the presence of the Word Incarnate. Through her consent: let it be done to me, she realized God's plan and through the Holy Spirit became the true Mother of the Son of God, but also our mother. Her Son, assuming human body, humbled himself to share in our humanity. In giving birth to Jesus, who is the source of our salvation, Mary contributed with her maternal service to impart this grace to men. She truly is our Mother as – through her intercession and prayer – she continually contributes to our birth to the supernatural life: the Mother of the Son of God constantly intercedes for the grace of salvation for all of us.

This weekend we also celebrate the Epiphany. We come with the Magi to Bethlehem to worship the Lord. We want to see and honor the Son of God, born of Mary, born in the greatest humility, who becomes a gift for all: from Mary, through Joseph, shepherds, and the mysterious foreign visitors themselves, to all of us. The glory of the Lord shone over the earth. In this way, not only did Christ come into the world -a light that shines in the darkness – but He is also revealed to all nations. The night of history was illuminated with an extraordinary radiance.

The light of the star that led the three wise men to Bethlehem is also a guide for us, the people of the 21st century. It prompts us to look for hope not in the promises of this world, but those out of this world. The star directs our gaze to Christ, the light of the world. The moment when the Magi, led by a star, adored the new King of the Jews, symbolizes that it is no longer the elements, the laws of matter that govern the world and man, but it is the personal God who rules over the universe. And if we know this Person and allow Him to know us, then we are no longer slaves to the universe and its laws – we are free.

Finally, we know that the Magi, warned in a dream, return to their homes by another way. It is an indication that whoever encounters God is profoundly changed, begins to walk in different ways, follow different paths. The encounters surrounding the Incarnation of the Son of God radically change everyone involved. Mary from a simple girl becomes the Mother of God; Joseph from a humble carpenter develops into a housemaker of God; Shepherds tending their sheep come to tend to the needs of God-Man; Magi from pagans become the first believers. The story of Jesus's Nativity has to transform us also. If it doesn't, it simply means we haven't encountered Him yet.


