Fr. Tomaszis Weekly Reflection

In today's Gospel Jesus assumes the position of a Rabbi – teacher -- coming to the synagogue of his native Nazareth. After reading the passage from the book of the prophet Isaiah, He sits down. Jewish teachers taught their students in a seated posture. Jesus presents himself in the authority of a teacher and chooses the passage that announces the coming of the Messiah, expected by the people of Israel, and prophesized by Isaiah.

When Isaiah writes about the Messiah coming to proclaim a year acceptable to the Lord, He refers to the Jubilee Year, that the Israelites observed every 50 years. 7 years times 7 was considered the fullness of years, with the Jubilee Year -50 – concluding the cycle before restarting it. This year was a time of forgiveness of debts and punishments. The indebted and the poor took advantage of this year's benefits the most. Christ came to people who are in need, that is, to the poor in spirit, to those who need His mercy.

The Messiah's mission in this special time is to proclaim liberty to captives and to let the oppressed go free. God – in the beginning of time – gave people freedom, which is the inalienable foundation of our life. This God-given freedom needs to be announced because it is difficult; one has to learn it to be truly free. To learn it means to experience it in a way so that it does not become our own bondage, internal enslavement, nor a cause of enslavement to others. As free people, we have the choice between right and wrong, good or evil; therefore we have to learn how to be truly free, to take responsibility for our actions. As St. Pope John Paul II stated, speaking before the United Nations General Assembly: "Freedom is the measure of human dignity and greatness."

The Church constantly upholds the fundamental value of freedom, which it also understands as the measure of our fidelity to God. We are free to the extent that we submit our lives to the will of God. Properly understood, freedom is the opposite to both anarchy and lawlessness. By inviting Jesus Christ – the Messiah – into our hearts, we become truly free. We are called to the freedom which no earthly restriction can deprive us of.

Who wants to be free cannot separate their lives from God, because it was He who, through His Son, freed us from the slavery to sin and bestowed upon us true freedom. *The year acceptable to the Lord* continues. Jesus wants to give us all the gift of inner freedom; however, it is received only by those who recognize themselves as poor and in need, those who acknowledge themselves as enslaved and blinded by sin. In order to become truly free, we need to realize what we need to be freed from.
