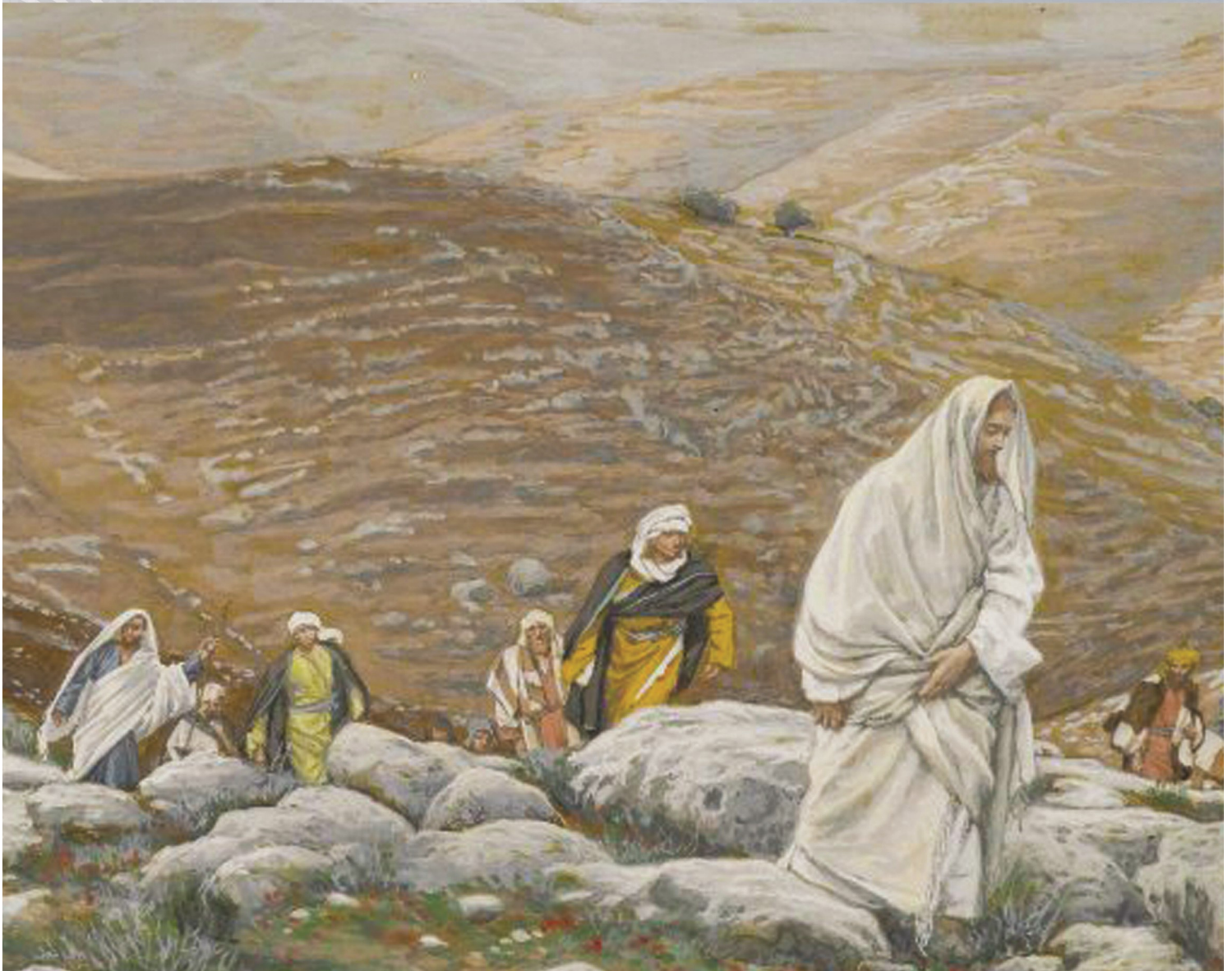

Fr. Tomasz's Weekly Reflection

Jesus passed through the midst of those who wanted to throw Him down the mountain headlong, with great peace. The people who drove him there turned delight into a rage. False love easily turns into true hate. Sometimes tragedies happen to us in order to force us to leave the environment where they take place.

If Jesus didn't come to the synagogue and take up the role of a teacher, He wouldn't have experienced such treatment from the people of Nazareth, but because He did, the truth could no longer be hidden. The best doctor is one who allows the patient to heal the sick belief that he is healthy. In the perfidious world, truth cannot please; in such world truth always faces rejection. Being rejected by our loved ones causes fear, leaves us mutilated in our feelings, withdrawn from life, and triggers our defensive mechanisms. Discovering or bringing up the memories of rejection can induce an outburst of aggression, which is the release of embedded anger. Rejected who have not forgiven are rejecting others in the most painful way. Especially when they refuse to recognize it in themselves.

What hurt did Jesus reveal on the soul of the people of Nazareth by his words? Perhaps these people have rejected true God in favor of worshiping a skewed version of Him, and when this truth was revealed to them, they could not forgive themselves for it. It is not easy to admit they have been mocking God for their entire lives, and then to ask humbly for his forgiveness, to repent and forgive themselves. What would happen if we were told that all our religious practices are imitations or fakes?

Let's look at it from the opposite perspective. How would we feel talking to someone who brazenly shows signs of impatience, hypocritically lies to us, and tells us that they love us, while their love is a mere attempt on manipulation? That person constantly looks at their watch, mumbles something incomprehensible under their breath, or picks their nose and suddenly speeds up their speech pretentiously, and then quickly leaves us without saying goodbye? Would that offend us? Yet, aren't most of our prayers just like that, and maybe even worse? When someone points out to us our attitude, do we feel angry and wonder what they want from us? Or maybe we throw at God scraps – leftovers of our time, prayers, attention, etc. Or maybe we are convinced that our presence at the Eucharist is a heroic sacrifice on our part. I'm almost sure there will be those who will be outraged by what they have read now.

The greatest outrage we feel is towards the one whom we have wronged the most, because their hurt is the evidence of our wickedness. We can hate God because He proves to us that we treat Him like a beggar who is thrown out the door, as a thief to be chased away, as a malicious person who is responsible for our misfortune. If we saw how we really treat God in our prayers, we would be surprised why He is still not offended by it.
