Fr. Thomas's Weekly Reflection

Every time I read this story of the disciples being told to *put out into deep water*, I find a deeper meaning of it. In the amazing catch, Simon has experienced a great defeat, because a carpenter told him – a seasoned fisherman – how to catch more fish than ever before; he was also victorious, because he decided to be obedient to God's Word. But it doesn't stop there. After they had pulled their nets ashore, Jesus told them to drop everything. Why go to the trouble of fishing for a few hours, then haul the net with all you caught, risk the boat sinking, and then abandon everything? They could really feel disappointment or burst out with a grudge against Jesus. But nothing like this is recorded in the Gospel. I admire their obedience.

Many of us work hard to achieve something in life, have a perfect family, go to college, travel abroad, fulfill our hopes and expectations, make dreams come true, be successful. But all of that might be lost in a matter of seconds. In those moments, do we share the attitude of the Apostles? Do we consent to whatever God may request from us? To take a step forward, you need to lift your foot off the position it occupies. There are moments in our lives that seem to be demanding from us the abandoning of all we have, but in reality, we're only asked to take a step forward. When you lose everything, you can gain more than everything. You gain God Himself.

You may blame God for not letting you make your dreams come true or you may have a grudge against others, that they did not help you keep at least one fish from the net full of them. You may feel sorry for yourself, that you weren't cunning or crafty, and allowed yourself to be cheated on.

From a fisherman we become a fish caught in the net. But Jesus just wants us to leave it all behind. Give up regret and resentment, let go of what we are still clinging to, and follow Jesus. He has something more beautiful for us. If we lose anything with God, it is only to inherit something much more beautiful with Him. Will clinging to regret and anger, hatred and unforgiveness help us in any way? Jesus allows – no – He encourages us to move on. He sends an impulse to let go of what is still holding us, and catch up with Him! Let go of what we idolized, to seize God Himself.

Peter did not make himself angry, leaving behind the nets full of fish. He just saw that this prevents him from following Jesus. Every time I read about it, I am amazed at his calmness and obedience that do not ask for any explanation from Jesus, even though Jesus told him to give up everything. Even what was the result of a miracle!
