

Fr. Tomosz's Weekly Reflection

Give, and gifts will be given to you. These are the words spoken

Give, and gifts will be given to you. These are the words spoken by Jesus when He is about to send his apostles to spread the Gospel, so that his Kingdom would be known through gestures of selfless love. Gestures of generous gifts are the most credible way of evangelization.

Life is a gift from God. Existence, precisely because it is a gift, cannot be identified as a mere possession or private property. We live in a society who practices rejection and indifference, and in order to oppose it, we need to emphasize the very nature of a gift, recognized as a paradigm capable of countering individualism and social fragmentation, of forging new ties and various forms of human cooperation between nations and cultures. Dialogue, which is a necessary factor of any gift, makes it possible to experience human growth and development, capable of breaking through the consolidated patterns of social interactions. We have to realize that giving and gifting are not the same thing. Gifting does not equate to the simple act of giving, because gift in its nature is relational, does not focus on what is offered, but who offers it. Gift is always about a person: both giving and receiving. It cannot be reduced to simply handing over some goods or objects. It differs from simple giving precisely because it includes a gift of self and implies a desire to form a bond. Gift is a mutual recognition of parties involved, which is a necessary quality of the social bond. Gift is a reflection of God's love which culminates in the incarnation of Jesus Christ, and his death and resurrection.

We realize that every one of us is created poor, needy and experiencing want. To be given life we need our parents; after we are born, we need their care; throughout our lives we need teachers and role models; to experience love we need somebody to love. Hence, in no moment of our lives are we able to completely free ourselves from the need and help of others, nor is it ever possible to remove the desire for having another in our lives. This is the condition that characterizes 'creatures.' Recognizing this truth encourages us to remain humble and to practice solidarity as a virtue indispensable for our existence.

This awareness urges us to act in a responsible and deliberate manner, keeping in mind the good that is both personal and common. Only when man conceives himself not as a closed world, but rather as someone inherently connected with all others — as 'brothers and sisters' — is it possible to practice social solidarity, based on the common good. We must not be afraid to recognize our needs and to admit our inability to provide ourselves with everything we need, the truth that we are unable to overcome all limitations on our own. Let us not be afraid of this truth, because God in his Son, Jesus Christ, emptied himself, gifted to us and stooped down to our poverty, to respond to all our needs and provide for us what we cannot afford ourselves, the gift of Salvation.

A culture of selflessness and gift is essential to overcoming the culture of profit and rejection. Good can only be fully enjoyed when it is shared. The indicator of the good life of a Christian is his joy in a gratuitous gift.

LENTEN DISCIPLINES OF FASTING AND ABSTINENCE

Catholics in good health ages 18-59 are required to fast and to abstain from meat on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday.

Fasting consists of eating only one meal, with the possibility of two smaller snacks that do not add up to a single full meal.

Catholics ages 14 and older are to abstain from meat on all Fridays of Lent.
