Fr. Tomasz's Weekly Reflection

What intrigues me in today's Gospel passage, is that the devil approached Jesus in the desert only after He became hungry. The enemy wants to deceive our natural hunger for love and longing for God. The temptation is reminiscent of a fast-food vendor, offering us cheap hot dogs that passed their expiration date, while we are on our way to the city's finest restaurant. Hunger can make us take advantage of the discounted offer, filling our stomach with a mustard-dripping chunk of green meat, stuffed into a stale bun. That's what Satan does. He stands in our way because he knows that we desire the divine food, but using his intelligence and social engineering techniques, he offers us the consumption of his own dishes. He pushes this rotten hot dog into our hands every time we experience hunger, making us dependent on him, and preventing us from reaching our original destination – the fine eatery.

We are hungry for feelings, knowledge, power, effects, passion, money, love, comfort, lies and truth. Man – in his own nature – exemplifies hunger and want. You and I are hungry, but what do we really hunger for? What are we striving for? Evil preys the most on our hunger for glory, tendemess, love, as well as for comfort, convenience and security. This is what we see in the devil's temptations. Due to the fact that he tempted Jesus, we know what he offers, and, at the same time, what area is the most starving within us.

Temptation is an opportunity to get to know our deepest longings. Once we know what we want, we need to think who can satisfy this need? A seller at a hot dog stand, or a chef at the five-star restaurant? The choice is ours. The problem is that the fast-food place is just around the corner, offering to satisfy the need immediately, while the fine restaurant is on the other side of the town, requiring an effort to get there. Even though we may see people at the hot dog booth, stained with mustard and showing signs of food poisoning, or already lying on the street squirming in pain, we might be so hungry that we will be willing to give up on the pursuit of the exquisite dining experience with excellent food, in favor of paying for that loathsome hot dog.

At the devil's stand people succumb to the fleshly lust and ultimately consume one another. Sometimes we witness a couple, exchanging passionate kisses, demonstrating their corporeal desires. People reaching for the highest positions in the food chain, imbued with the admiration of thousands of supporters. Individuals hoarding large sums of money in banks, just like carnivorous animals hoarding mountains of meat after a successful hunt.

We know well that we must eat in order to survive. The well-known saying "man does not live to eat but eats to live" can be applied both to food in the everyday ordinary sense, and to the spiritual food. In both cases, food is necessary for life. In both cases malnutrition can cause death. Let us never fall victim to the one offering cheap substitute food, but rather let us satisfy our hunger with what comes from the giver of true life.
