To Be "in Christ" Means to Be a Servant

In the prelude to today's great Passion Narrative, Saint Paul reminds us that we find our hope in the "emptiness" and "humility" of Christ Jesus; a life that led to the cross, but through the cross, to glory and exaltation. The way is not easy. Good stewards know that it requires a willingness to lay aside all rights of personal privilege; emptying ourselves in the service of others; embracing values different from the values of the world. It requires an understanding that to be "in Christ" means to be a servant because Christ came into the world, not as Lord but as servant. What crosses are we willing to carry? What worldly values we are willing to forego in order to share Christ's glory?

Fr. Tomasz's Weekly Reflection

Current events show us that human beings are capable of fighting against a stronger aggressor in the name of justice and freedom. We can fight for our existence, family, region and country, allowing ourselves to experience great difficulties and hardships for the greater cause. Can we fight similarly for our faith, for our spirituality, for our souls? We have a wonderful example of Christ, who, despite the wrongs and cruelties that were inflicted on him, fought for our freedom, for our souls. Today the Lord expects just such a surge from us. A move that will strengthen us, lead us to His salvation.

One of the people in the History of Salvation who represents such uncompromising attitude is the prophet Isaiah, who in today's first reading, called by God to announce His will to the chosen people and later also to us, makes himself known as a responsible, obedient and God-loving man. He states unequivocally that he received from God the gift of listening and speaking, in order to make known to others what had been revealed to him. As he himself says: "The Lord GOD is my help, therefore I am not disgraced; I have set my face like flint, knowing that I shall not be put to shame." Another one is St. Paul, with great zeal explaining to the community of the Philippians that our Lord Jesus Christ, although being God, decided to humiliate, emaciate himself, showing an absolute obedience to the Father: "He humbled himself, becoming obedient to the point of death, even death on a cross. Because of this, God greatly exalted him and bestowed on him the name which is above every name, that at the name of Jesus every knee should bend, of those in heaven and on earth and under the earth."

Finally, the Gospel introduces us directly to the atmosphere of Holy Week, telling us about the entire Mystery of the Passion and Death of Jesus, emphasizing the enormous burden of responsibility He took upon his shoulders – accepting death on the cross for our sins. As a result, our salvation comes out of his great love for us, and from an extraordinary obedience to God the Father. This obedience is evident at every moment, from judgment, through the scourging, the way to Golgotha, to the last words: "Father, into your hands I commend my spirit."

So if we fight for freedom and justice, let's also think about responsibility and love. And if we add obedience, we get the idea of what the Lord expects of us. These virtues, presented in fullness in Jesus Christ himself, over the centuries, have caused an amazing turn in the life of the entire human family. They changed the entire order of history, and they WILL change history before our very eyes. It is worth meditating on them on the eve of Holy Week.

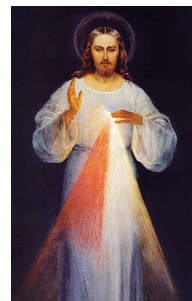
