Fr. Tomasz's Weekly Reflection

Few could expect, as we were preparing for Lent preceding today's feast, that we would have an unexpected retreat for us, for the whole Church, for the whole world, organized by Vladimir Putin. Retreat that fill us with pain and compassion. Retreat, which, as it were, forced us to think about death, when we were preparing to celebrate the Death and Resurrection of our Lord Jesus Christ, and all related spiritual celebrations.

The spiritual experience of Easter, with this added element of war, strengthens our relationship with God, makes us able to reflect on the transience of life, on our past and future. For on earth, moving between life and death, between victories and defeats, we need stimuli to notice what is right and good in our lives, and what is wrong and sometimes strictly evil.

The joy of today is experiencing the day of new life, the Lord's Resurrection. And this year it should make us realize that next to us are those who need our help and prayers. The words spoken by each priest during each Holy Mass: "Through Him, and with Him, and in Him" remind us of the most important truth that we should live following the example of Christ. Through His Resurrection, Jesus shows us what awaits us after passing from one form of life to another.


The words: This man God raised on the third day and granted that he be visible, not to all the people, but to us, the witnesses chosen by God in advance, who ate and drank with him after he rose from the dead. He commissioned us to preach to the people and testify that he is the one appointed by God as judge of the living and the dead, exude hope, giving us strength not only to fight our daily difficulties, but also to know that ultimately all evil will be conquered.

May the awareness that thanks to the sacrifice of Jesus Christ we will also reach our destiny, that is, what God the Father has promised us, strengthen our faith. God's power is expressed in hope and joy. So we need to entrust to the Risen One our fears, problems and uncertainties. And on this Easter morning we should go to the tomb — like Peter and John — to enter the tomb and to see, "see and believe." Christ, who is the foundation of our faith and the source of eternal happiness, is risen!

"Jesus, I Trust in You!"

We will pray the Divine Mercy Novena beginning on Good Friday, April 15th, and concluding on Divine Mercy Sunday, April 24th.
