Fr. Tomasz's Weekly Reflection In the face of the news about the Risen Christ, Thomas — one of the

In the face of the news about the Risen Christ, Thomas – one of the twelve – utters words of protest and challenge: *Unless I see the mark of the nails in his hands and put my finger into the nailmarks and put my hand into his side, I will not believe*. The first day after Jesus' Resurrection becomes a witness to the problem of faith in the Mystery of Merciful Love, more powerful than sin and death. The challenge presented by Thomas shows us the ever-recurring drama of the human heart, which experiences the mystery of suffering and death, and at the same time is filled with longing for a real life and immortality.

The Apostles' faith was challenged because they directly experienced the Passion and Death of Jesus. Suffering and Death of Christ, till this day, remains a drama of spiritual shattering. Primarily because it means the loss of purpose, forfeiture of the path that was being followed. For to go ahead means to be aware of the goal. It reminds me that Thomas, during the Last Supper, asks Jesus a more fundamental question: Lord, we don't know where you are going, how can we know the way? It is difficult to accept Christ's answer: I am the Way, and the Truth, and the Life. No one comes to the Father except through me. Especially when one witnessed Jesus' Passion and Death, it is hard to agree with the ending of the Way.

Let us be open and honest: Thomas' skeptical attitude was not an isolated incident, but the general attitude of the disciples, who did not always understand their Master; to mention only the story of Jesus and his disciples at the Caesarea Philippi, when Peter first correctly identifies Jesus as the Son of the Living God, but then completely misunderstands the mission of the Messiah; or the two disciples on the way to Emmaus uttering their famous *But we were hoping that*...

We can imagine the Apostles, fearing the vengeance of the Jewish leaders, isolated from the world, closed in their pain after the loss of their Teacher and Master, losing sight of the perspective of the way ahead and the awareness of the goal to which Jesus Christ was leading them. That is why Thomas' crisis of faith was needed at that time for the entire community, but it is also needed for us today. Thomas' doubting became the basis of a new encounter with Christ. For faith in Jesus Christ is more than just a dry statement and summary of the facts, e.g., that Jesus was a prophet mighty in deed and word before God and all the people, or that when the disciples were in the Upper Room, for the fear of the Jews, Jesus came despite the closed doors, and he showed them his hands and his side. The disciples rejoiced when they saw the Lord. Jesus said to them again, "Peace be with you."

Faith in the Risen Christ is a divine gift, a proof of those realities we do not see, but at the same time it is a human response through internal struggle. In this human struggle for the true sense of faith, one often needs to lose faith, the "official" one, puffed up, cocky, protective, preached from here to there, in order to find the real one, the one that is simply an encounter in the dark: when doubt becomes cast-iron certainty, true faith that is completely unbelievable.

Experiencing the presence of the Crucified and Risen Christ in every Eucharist, let us ask Him that — in the midst of the daily difficulties of faith — we never lose our goal and the perspective of participating in His final victory over sin and death.
