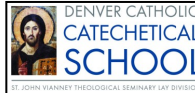
Fr. Tomasz's Weekly Reflection

What I am about to write shouldn't be treated as a Gospel, but according to the Gospel records, fishing was never one of Simon Peter's strengths. If it weren't for Jesus, he would never have achieved great success in what was his bread-winning profession. Peter was a fisherman, not a shepherd, and initially Jesus asked him to become a fisher of men, but – since that didn't work out too well – ultimately Jesus settles at calling Peter to become a shepherd of souls.

What does this career change actually mean? One cannot just fish for souls all the time. After all, they need to be fed, nourished, given consistently from the food of spiritual peace, led to the lofty meadows of spiritual heights, shown the path to heaven. To forgive someone's sins, to encourage conversion with a word of spiritual direction or to correct in the confessional is an easier thing than to show a patient, persistent love, to endure someone's rocky journey of faith or to lead by a consistent example. Fishing at night has miserable effects, especially when, despite their enormous efforts, the fishers of men forget to allow Jesus to be with them in the boat. The darkness for the Church begins when priests look forward more to the latest gadgets than to an encounter with God's Word, when they place their trust in electronics and technology more than in God.

And then there is this right side of the boat. Why was the catch on the right so abundant? If this boat is an image of the Church, then Jesus seems to clearly say that in the Church there is no chance of success in acting "on the left", especially when those tasked with the explanation of God's Word lack elementary righteousness. But the right side of the boat is way more than just about acting in accordance with God's law and human righteousness. The right side is the side of the Messiah, who sitteth on the right hand of God the Father Almighty. It is also the side of the sheep, not the goats, from the image of the final judgment. This is perhaps also an indication of those who preferred to pluck off their right eye and cut off their right hand, rather than lose the Kingdom of God.

The very act of fishing can also be seen as a reference to Noah's Flood. If so, it indicates that God is willing to give one last chance even to those who are flooded and drowning in their own sin. The point is, Peter never comes back to fishing again...
