Fr. Tomasz's Weekly Reflection

Good Shepherd Sunday is most often an occasion to pray for priestly vocations. Special services and liturgies are organized in parishes; some dioceses schedule their priestly ordination around that time.

The shepherd is at the head of the flock. Today's Gospel says that sheep listen to the shepherd's voice. He is the leader of the sheep and is responsible for them. However, the changes of contemporary religiosity are going in such a direction that more and more often sheep want to take the place of shepherds, and sometimes both sheep and shepherds lack precise knowledge about the pasture – the Church – in which they are to live and feel safe.

Years ago, in Poland, there was a debate whether the catechesis should be introduced in public schools. There was a surprisingly significant group of Catholics protesting it with the statement: "We are the Church." But we don't need to go to Poland to witness that, as many politicians in the US declare themselves Catholic, claiming they can do whatever feels right, because they are the Church. The response to such statements was given by one priest who wrote an article that can be summarized by affirming that the statement "We are the Church" is not entirely correct. It is not enough to say that we are the Church, because the Church is us and the Holy Spirit, together.

The path of the formation of any dogma is always bottom-up. The Spirit moves the faith of all the faithful, the whole Church, and then – after it is properly studied by the Magisterium – it is officially announced. When the Church deals with her doctrine, it is primarily because it is the matter of her identity. In order to be able to answer the questions about the way the Church should function, it is first necessary to create a canon of components of her identity. This canon should include not only dogmas, but also the entire moral and social teaching of the Church, its law, and even broadly understood culture.

Therefore, Good Shepherd Sunday should be an occasion for a deeper reflection on the theology of the Church. This reflection must cover not only the issue of shepherds but also pastures. Where are the boundaries beyond which we are no longer the Catholic Church? Can these questions be avoided? Especially that the inquiries about the meaning of the Sacraments or moral theology are heard almost universally?

On this Good Shepherd Sunday, it is also important to bring the awareness of the primacy of Peter and his successors, the ultimate earthly shepherds. Even if we feel lost and filled with various doubts, we are always given a shepherd's voice we should follow. Good Shepherd Sunday should be an occasion to pray for those who proclaim the Word of God and shepherd God's flock.
