Fr. Tomasz's Weekly Reflection

As Christians, we know perfectly well that there is a huge demand for love in the world. Jesus in the Upper Room reminds us of this, giving a new law the law of love, which is the hallmark of his disciples: "I give you a new commandment: love one another. As I have loved you, so you also should love one another. This is how all will know that you are my disciples, if you have love for one another." Christian love of neighbor is not only a trademark, but also a sign of unity in the community of believers. It is not so much the result of a singular sacrifice for another, but rather the deepest desire of the heart for the good of someone else, who is the object of love. Love is what brings that good about. Paradoxically, however, the greatest good benefits the one who loves others, who gives himself. A man created in the image and likeness of God cannot fully realize himself differently than through love, i.e. through a selfless, honest gift of himself, gift of his life.

The most important apostolate that Christians can do in the world, the best testimony of faith, is to work together that – within the Church – there is always an atmosphere of authentic love. It's safe to begin with small steps, to see in others Jesus who needs our help. Without mutual love, it is difficult to imagine a normal functioning home, work place, or a parish. That is why we often look for love around us. There are many people around who can be identified as good men. However, goodness to others unfortunately - isn't always something Christians can be recognized by. What do we need to do to make it happen? How to love those whom we hate because of the harm done, whom we have put on our "black list"? How to make sure that our Christianity does not limit itself to mere prolixity?

First and most important thing is not to wait for others to do it, but rather to take things in our own hands, before it's too late. Tomorrow is not guaranteed to anyone, neither young nor old. Perhaps today is the last opportunity to approach those who need our love? Therefore, let us not hesitate, do it today, because if it turns out that there's no tomorrow, we will regret the day when we didn't find time for one smile, for one kiss, for one act of kindness. Let us always be close to those we love, to say 'I am sorry', 'please', 'thank you' and all other kind words we know. What is there out of our love for others that we keep to ourselves? Nobody will ever know the secrets of your interior life. Therefore, let us ask the Lord for strength, wisdom and courage so that we can express it in the open.
