Fr. Tomasz's Weekly Reflection

Jesus goes away, so that the Holy Spirit may come. God is leaving, only to become even closer to us. Therefore, his departure brings peace. When Jesus speaks of peace in today's Gospel passage, He uses a regular, daily Jewish greeting, but in the context, everything takes on a completely different dimension. This greeting is not just Him wishing them 'a good day.' Jesus' peace didn't just mean something like quieting their troubled hearts or calming down their excited emotions. The peace that Christ gives is a gift that brings man happiness. This peace has the power to completely put back together what is broken. Or even more: someone who is broken.

Jesus' words are not mere good wishes. They have the power of an order that cannot be opposed. When Jesus says that He gives his disciples peace, they experience it not as a result of their personal commitment – their own doing, but as an intervention that reflects the power of creation. He did not ask them to simply calm down, but He gave them this peace. The Hebrew word used here: 'Shalom' is an imperative which removes fear and anxiety, integrates internally and externally human existence. It is also a reality understood as happiness, salvation brought by the Messiah.

There is a tremendous power hidden in the ordinary words of the Bible. God has placed extraordinary holiness in the hearts of ordinary people. Jesus so earnestly prayed for peace, not for himself, but for others. This affects me a lot, because most of the time I only pray for my own peace. Only in the current situation, affected by the reality of war raging – relatively – so close to home, I find in myself more concern for peace of others, but it is still not some peace that Jesus calls for. While I pray for peace soothing emotions and silencing cries, Jesus asks for peace that harmonizes, rebuilds in the Holy Spirit, saves. I now feel encouraged to pray more eagerly for others, with more earnestness and zeal, asking that no one may be deprived of the peace of Christ.

We all need this peace from Jesus now more than anything else. A peace that makes one more fearless than a proverbial hero. The peace that removes all confusion. This peace brought by the Paraclete, the Holy Spirit, the peace that is one of the fruits of the Spirit, as Paul wrote in the Letter to the Galatians. The Holy Spirit is like the wind that does not scatter but gathers, does not overturn, but lifts up, does not extinguish, but kindles, does not frighten, but gives courage.
