# Fr. Tomasz's Weekly Reflection

In the New Testament, the Greek word *Dynamis* is used often to indicate a supernatural power, capable of healing, casting out demons, bringing out the good, the power that emanated from Jesus himself. After being tempted in the desert, Jesus returned to Galilee in the power of the Spirit, *Dynamis*, and it was this power that gave Him the ability to heal. The crowd tried to touch Him, because this power was coming out of Him; it was almost possible to see this power in action. The same *Dynamis* overshadowed Mary on the day of the Annunciation. Still, the same power was experienced by a woman who, having suffered from bleeding for 12 years, touched Jesus' robes and was healed. That power was bestowed upon the Apostles when Jesus sent them on their first mission.

For us, the most important thing is not to forget that this *power is made perfect in weakness*. The most beautiful side of human weakness is humility, meekness, humbleness. It is a thorough knowledge of the truth about oneself and its total acceptance. When we present such an attitude, we make ourselves available to the Holy Spirit; we invite Him to come down into our lives. If God is to be everything in us, we must become nothing. Giving consent to our own misery and helplessness is not easy. Getting to know our wretchedness can cause us to rebel and contradict ourselves in anger or despair. The truth can literally crush us. In this experience, we need a true love for ourselves, not hatred or abhorence.

St. Augustine wrote in his Confessions: "Give what thou commandest and command what thou wilt." (X, 29) Man can do nothing by himself. Especially when it comes to Salvation, because he needs the grace of Jesus Christ, and thus the power of the Holy Spirit. The revelation and outpouring of such great power can only happen under one condition: an acceptance of the truth about oneself, especially the awareness of one's misery and feebleness. Only total spiritual poverty, letting go of the sentiment that we are able to turn away from evil and its effects solely by the virtue of our own good intentions and efforts, can invoke the presence of the might of the Holy Spirit.

Therefore, let us not despair over our powerlessness, worry about our ineptitude, or judge ourselves harshly because of our incompetence. Jesus predicted it. Don't be scandalized when the only thing you can afford is the meanness of sin. Don't be surprised by your irredeemable spiritual condition, but rather be amazed by the power of the Spirit, who is able to make a saint out of someone like you. Discouragement is a sign of an attempt of a reliance on oneself rather than the Holy Spirit. Saint James writes in his letter that *we all fall short in many respects*. Not a few, but all. Therefore, let us not think that someone is better than us. The reality is that we are all the same.
