Fr. Tomasz's Weekly Reflection

“What I’m going to say will hurt you. It will surprise you. And it even may offend you. Listen carefully. It hurts me to say it: I know many Christians, in fact many priests, who would be offended if I took them to all the places where I go. Because they have gone backwards. They have diminished the message of my Gospel and closed their hearts. They created a list of easy, hassle-free visits, simple problems and insignificant sins, a list that everyone can agree with. A list that makes them feel comfortable: won’t get them dirty, will keep them decent in the eyes of others. A list that requires no risk at all.

For such a list one does not even need to be a Christian, let alone a priest. You come to the sinner only when you are absolutely sure that you are not jeopardizing your good name. You’re abandoning the drunken sinners in a roadside ditch, you loathe them, their problems, their ways...

But as I died for you, I did not weigh the risks, nor did I calculate the compromises. I risked everything and lost my honor and reputation. They called me possessed and an ally of Beelzebub, a friend of sinners and prostitutes; they condemned me to a judicial tribunal and carried out a shameful trial...

This is how your redemption was accomplished. But you, who are to spread it with courage and love, you limit it: only easy sins and sinners who do not disgust. Easy repentance. Easy forgiveness. Easy apostleship.

Meanwhile, one has to fight for these broken, mutilated, complicated and difficult souls; abnormal and rebellious souls. One has to fight for them, risking the loss of honor, name and face - because society judges and condemns this Christian, this priest, who dares to deal with a stigmatized, cursed, defamed sinner...

And I?

I visited people who had been cohabiting for twenty years and had not entered the church since then. I visited an adulterer who lives openly with a married woman. They refused to baptize their children. I visited the apartment of a pervert who organizes orgies with his friends and who a few days ago attempted suicide. I was in the apartment of a woman who has been running a tryst house with minors for many years. I visited a blasphemer, a drunkard and a scoundrel.

Don't protest! Do you not think they are broken enough for me to bring them mercy and compassion? Think of the sinner most repugnant, most degenerate, most guilty, most punishable by all laws - I am with him. You visit easy sinners. No problem. Broken souls, black sheep are mine. They need my love the most.”

These are the words Christ says in the book “My Broken Christ” by Fr. Ramón Cué, SJ. I couldn’t find an English translation; therefore, forgive my crude interpretation. You may say that this is an easy way: instead of preparing a reflection I translated an excerpt from the book. But I don’t think I could have said it any better. I would like these words to reach my consciousness and the consciousness of each one of you. Because as we walk with Eucharistic Jesus through the streets of Greeley today, Christ cannot be given a route, cannot be ordered to be limited only to clean streets, cannot be told to step only on the flower petals, with the tolling of bells and the sounds of hymns, surrounded by crowds with priests, altar boys and girls in white dresses. He also walks through those areas which, even during the day, we are afraid to visit; He steps into the most disgusting burrows that do not resemble apartments, dens that reek of alcohol and human excretions, where the smell of incense, ringing of bells and beautiful singing never reaches. But He goes there because He loves every human being. And only the question arises: where are the crowds that accompanied Him today during the procession?
