Other important matters compete for our attention. Some of us must make heart-wrenching choices, but there is urgency about Jesus' mission to bring forth God's kingdom. His demand is that we proclaim the Kingdom of God now. Is this our first priority, or do we have other priorities?

Fr. Tomasz's Weekly Reflection

In our lives we tend to value what we have achieved through serious efforts or obtained at a high price. In contrast to what comes easily and is cheap. Jesus did not promise his disciples an easy life. An experience of a difficulty forms within us a determination, which in turn strengthens our will. Without a strong will to reach one's goal, it is impossible to achieve it; on the other hand, nothing reinforces the will more than obstacles.

If we think about it from the perspective of faith, all our life and all our deeds should have one goal in mind: God. Yet such level of commitment characterizes only few people. After all the first commandment, as stated by Jesus himself – is to love God totally - with all your heart, with all your strength, with all your soul, in any place and at any time. It would be a mistake to think that life goes its own way while faith goes the other. This separation reminds me of the reasoning behind including swine on the list of the unclean animals in the Old Testament: as an argument to justify its impurity, it was stated that its hooves were separated, unlike the cattle's, and that it did not belong to the family of ruminants. Church Fathers saw in pigs an analogy of someone who separates his life from his own religiosity, and sets these two as different and exclusive realities, but also as a person who doesn't meditate, or ruminate, over the Word of God. Such a person is internally split, unable to make any strong statements of will.

On the contrary, in Jesus, we see an extremely coherent will. With his entire being, resolutely, He sets on a journey to Jerusalem and follows the path of love of God and man. The geography of his journey is completely parallel to his spiritual pilgrimage towards the summit of his mission. What he experienced in an earthly City of David was tightly related to what opened the gates of the heavenly Jerusalem. For everything we experience here on earth, we experience it as an event on our journey to heaven.

The analysis of the passage from today's Gospel, where Jesus is making the decision to go to Jerusalem, reveals that this verse has an interesting original meaning. The original text in Greek uses the expression: "to prosopon esterisen", which literally means that Jesus "hardened his face". In English we could say that He "gritted his teeth" - accepted a difficult situation and dealt with it in a determined way. From then on, the face of Jesus expressed the uncompromising decision, the affirmation of the path chosen. Before, Jesus' face was full of compassion and mercy, but from the moment of setting off for Jerusalem, it took on a cold seriousness. His will becomes steadfast as He persuades his disciples that if they really want to follow Him, they must recognize the ruthless nature of the choice and all its consequences.

Recognizing the relentless will of Jesus, let us strengthen ourselves, so that we may not run away from the truth about ourselves and God, from the community, work, family, from maturing in faith.
