Fr. Tomasz's Weekly Reflection

Today's Liturgy of the Word invites us to rejoice. Each of us wants to experience joy in life. Even more: we are called to joy; but not to any joy. We would like to be joyful, happy, content, feel good, and we would give a lot to make it happen. Sometimes we are even ready to do too much to achieve this goal.

In the Gospel, Jesus teaches us where we should look for a joy, even though He begins by teaching about what we are not to rejoice in. Jesus' point is that we should pursue a true joy, that is, lasting joy. Not momentary or temporary, which disappears as a result of changing circumstances, without our participation or will. After all, we care about it ourselves — If someone would give us a choice whether we want to feel joy all the time or, for example, for a few minutes a week, we will choose continuous joy without any doubt.

But Jesus is not alone in entrusting us with the guidance regarding joy. In today's first reading, Isaiah points out the context in which we will experience true joy, writing: rejoice with Jerusalem and be glad because of her. Joy is not something detached, something in itself, something experienced in isolation. Joy is a part of a larger whole. Joy is received through surrender to God. We often experience the feeling of sadness, dissatisfaction and bitterness when acting on our own. We are trying to become even more independent in the pursuit of joy, and – as a result – we become more and more distant from God and from the true joy He offers. We experience some short-term pleasures that we mistake for joy, before they dissolve into thin air and leave us empty-handed and disappointed. Despite this disappointment, if we do not turn to God and His will, we continue to put up more awakened hopes that are verified by reality.

Meanwhile, God, in Isaiah's narrative, makes it clear that *He will spread prosperity over Jerusalem like a river*, emphasizing that the source of joy is in the life-giving water that flows from Jerusalem. Of course, it's not about a geographic location, but about obeying God. This obedience is something that Jesus contrasts with even the greatest spiritual successes, for it would be wonderful to have full authority over unclean spirits, but it is nothing to the joy of having a place in the Kingdom of Heaven, which is meant for those who do God's will. It is worth mentioning that Jesus gave power over evil spirits to all of his disciples, including Judas, and he also had the opportunity to experience a wonderful spiritual triumph. We know well how his story ends.

Are we finding joy in living our lives in a way that is pleasing Christ, that our names are inscribed in the Book of Life, or are we rejoicing in seeing the immediate effects of our actions? Are we seeking joy by believing in something for which we do not have any tangible evidence, or are we relying on concrete, empirical miracles in our pursuit of joy?

Roe v. Wade Overturned

On June 24th, the Supreme Court of the United States overturned *Roe v. Wade* and *Casey v. Planned Parenthood*, returning the decisions about abortion laws to the states.

While this is a monumental event in our nation's history, Archbishop Aquila also reminds us that "the work continues, especially here in Colorado" which has already passed laws to guarantee the right to abortion in this state. "We must continue to lovingly speak the truth about the God-given dignity of every unique human life from conception to natural death, and we must increase our support of our archdiocesan and parish ministries that offer authentically compassionate care for women, their babies, and their families."

Finally, "we must always show Christ's mercy to anyone who has received or participated in an abortion...The work ahead of us here in Colorado will continue to be challenging, but we are reminded today that 'nothing will be impossible for God' (Luke 1:37)."
