

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Fr. Tomasz's Weekly Reflection

An old Polish proverb says: "Guest at home is like God at home." Overall, it expresses the conviction that by giving hospitality to another, we can obtain God's blessing. However, today's Bible readings suggest that the proverb may also have a more literal sense.

Abraham, sitting under the terebinth of Mamre, saw three men standing nearby, but when he went out to meet them, he did not encounter ordinary human beings, but God himself. Our Catholic English translation loses slightly this truth, when it formulates Abraham's expression as: Sir, if I may ask you this favor, please do not go on past your servant, while the original Hebrew, in place of the of the common English word Sir uses Adonai, which clearly indicates Abraham's understanding of the gravity of the situation, reflected in referring to the three persons using the word, Lord. This deep conviction that it was the Lord who appeared to him, triggered a deep religious fascination and a deeply human sense of care (washing his feet, preparing a meal, allowing him to rest).

The fact that Abraham, seeing three, speaks with one, so much inspired Rublev, that he presented this Old Testament scene in his famous icon as the revelation of the Holy Trinity, which I referred to in my homily for that Solemnity a few weeks ago. God's presence among people has been interpreted in a very realistic, almost literal way. In this very casual encounter, however, a series of mundane activities related to serving guests did not prevent Abraham from contemplating this divine reality.

It is no coincidence that in the liturgical readings this account was juxtaposed with the Gospel account of the event in Bethany, when Jesus visited Martha and Mary. Here, too, God came to the human settlement, appearing in a human form, also in a very literal sense. We get the impression that – paradoxically – God's revelation was more obvious to Abraham. The two evangelical sisters, Martha and Mary, behave differently, but probably neither of them is yet fully aware that it was God who came to welcome them. Christ suggests that, compared to Martha, Mary chose the better part. But what's the difference?

Looking at the scene superficially, we would be inclined to admit that Martha was right, because she was burdened with much serving, while Mary did nothing but just sat beside the Lord at his feet listening to him speak. Let's be honest: Martha's claims would be fully justified if an ordinary person came to their house. Meanwhile, Christ – the Messiah, the Savior, and God – came to them under the human form of Jesus. Of course, both sisters may not have known about it yet, but only Mary, who sat beside the Lord at his feet listening to him speak had a chance to find out about it. Completely absorbed in her work, burdened with much serving, Martha appears to have missed this opportunity. By not paying much attention to what Christ had to say, she ran the risk of missing out on the encounter with God.

The Gospel story of Martha and Mary does not solve the question whether work or prayer is better, more important. Rather, it assumes that there is no such question in the first place. It reminds us that even the most honest work can become an obstacle to salvation, if it will distract us from Christ, from prayer, from listening to the Lord's words.
