



Fr. Tomasz's Weekly Reflection

The three images presented today in the Liturgy of the Word are closely related to each other; they interpenetrate, overlap. First image: Abraham asking for mercy for doomed people of Sodom, insisting on looking for the righteous ones. The second image: just like a father teaches his children, so Jesus teaches his disciples how to pray to the Father – God. The third image: an example of the right attitude of each of us towards God.

To get something, we need to ask, just like we need to pay to buy something. But how can we get something from God? The only possibility is through prayer. God does not sell anything, but in His infinite love for us He gives when we ask – gives when we pray. Abraham knew this – we see him interceding on behalf of the inhabitants of Sodom, who are about to be destroyed because of their sins. God, in fact, wants to save them, this is why He allows Abraham to "haggle" as much as possible. God allows us to ask Him, just because He already wants to give us what we need.

God himself, in the person of Jesus Christ, taught us how to pray. Today's Gospel reminds us about it. Jesus – the Son – teaches us how to talk to the Father, how to pray to Him. He teaches us one of the most important, yet simplest prayers – the Lord's Prayer. In Luke's telling of the Gospel the prayer is even more simple than the one we're most familiar with: When you pray, say: Father, hallowed be your name, your kingdom come. Give us each day our daily bread and forgive us our sins for we ourselves forgive everyone in debt to us, and do not subject us to the final test. We learn these words when we are only children, repeating them until we die. What Jesus teaches his disciples is an art of conversation, which is an essential element of any relationship, also the relationship we have with God. Jesus presents us with an opportunity to realize that we always can turn to God with our problems, as well as with our joys, because He is Our Father.

Jesus uses the parable to make us realize that if we ask for something, look for something, we can always turn to the Father for help; that He will bestow upon us His mercy, encourage us and show us the way when we are lost. The most important thing though is the realization that we should not miss the opportunity to enjoy a relationship with God.

Lord, teach us to pray, support us with your grace, so that we can always find time to pray, to maintain our relationship with you.
