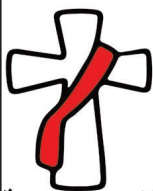

Fr. Tomasz's Weekly Reflection

We live in times when the sense of life being under threat is pretty common, which in turn increases the need for efficient law enforcement, security and healthcare services, for fair insurance institutions, as well as for new technological solutions that effectively prevent any infringement on material goods.

Today's Gospel shows that even in Christ's times there were burglars and thieves, since He used their image in his teaching. Jesus emphasized the truth that ultimately the safety of a home depends on human vigilance. Indeed, human vigilance can be aided, helped, guided, but never replaced: *if the master of the house had known the hour when the thief was coming, he would not have let his house be broken into.*

Our home is not only a building or an apartment, nor a place we live in. It is not limited to the material goods we have accumulated. Our home is rather our personality, family and nation, our faith and the Church, as well as our rich history and tradition. We live in all of this and draw from it all. It seems, however, that we have ceased to care for these various "floors of the home," and even its foundations. We tend to only care when our tangible, material treasures are threatened.

It is difficult to defend one's personality against numerous, often contradictory ways of life. It is difficult to develop one's own self in the face of the general aversion to self-criticism and self-discipline. It is not easy to defend the traditional family model when the number of offspring is regulated by abortion, and the lack of responsibility for sexual intercourse is camouflaged by contraception. And these threats are, among other things, the modern burglars, who break into our families and our lives. And worst of all, we often turn out to be the hosts who pretend not to notice the burglars, or even if we notice them, we don't want to point them out, afraid that we might rub them up the wrong way and destroy the imitation of peace we've been building for a while.

We also do not seem notice the dangerous burglars who want to destroy the house of our faith. It is not only about secularism or atheism, but also the activities of sects, movements, and the indoctrination of the media that undermine revealed truths and make people dependent on them in various ways. There are even groups that, under the guise of a membership in the Catholic Church, put Her in danger of being torn apart.

We need to realize that we live in a period of increased spiritual burglaries, and this applies to every area of life. However, we must not allow ourselves to be intimidated by such a phenomenon. We trust that the Holy Spirit, in his divine power, will overcome the most dangerous attacks. We must, however, be present in our home not only as ordinary members of the household, but above all as watchmen.
