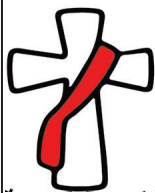

Running the Race

In today's second reading, we hear the author of the letter to the Hebrews liken the daily life of the Christian steward to a race, a long-distance race perhaps, certainly not a sprint; requiring endurance and a single-minded focus on Jesus at the finish line. Good stewards are firmly committed to running the race, to living the Christian life to the fullest, to keeping their eyes focused on Jesus. They don't grow weary. They don't lose heart. They know there is immense joy waiting for them at the finish line. Are you fully committed to living each day for Christ? Are you running the race, or are you simply jogging? Just walking? Sitting? Going backwards? Going nowhere? Some of us may want to reflect on what we can do to run the race with even more conviction. Others may want to reflect on how to simply enter the race and start running.

Fr. Tomasz's Weekly Reflection

One of the most painful experiences in our lives is the hostility of the dearest people to us: parents, siblings, children, spouses, relatives or friends. Many have faced it when they decided to choose Jesus as their Lord and Savior. It often begins with a hint of irony, then annoyance and judgment, finally even anger and threatening.

There is no growth without division, however. Even when we are created. After fertilization, the zygote is transported via the uterine tube, there it experiences a process of continuous mitotic divisions, so that after 30 hours there are already first two cells, after 50 hours 4, and after 70 hours 8 cells. Life is created by dividing, not by absorbing cells.

Jesus' teaching from the very beginning caused controversy and division among people. Some believed in the good news about salvation He brought; others not only rejected his message, but also tried to destroy him. We can't be indifferent to Christ. We must either be for him or against him. Those who declare indifference to Jesus are in fact against him.


The letter to the Hebrews reminds us today that Christianity is a difficult path of life. Christ experienced hostility himself, therefore, his disciples and followers also will be exposed to opposition, sometimes fighting against evil and giving testimony to faith with their blood. Divisions caused by faith are experienced in various groups, environments, even in families. Sometimes those conflicts concern the simplest of matters. It is enough when someone in the family decides to disregard one of the commandments for a monetary gain... or all it takes is for one to attend the Holy Mass on Sunday, while others prefer to go shopping or spend time in nature.

During each Eucharist we ask Jesus to give us the gift of peace. We say: *Lamb of God, who take away the sins of the world, grant us peace.* The priest prays: *Deliver us, Lord, we pray, from every evil, graciously grant peace in our days.* It is not Jesus who introduces divisions between people. The real cause of the split is the lack of faith, lack of love. Christ is constantly the giver of peace. He said *Peace I leave with you; my peace I give to you. Not as the world gives do I give it to you.* The division is a result of the fact that not everyone is ready to accept Jesus' peace.

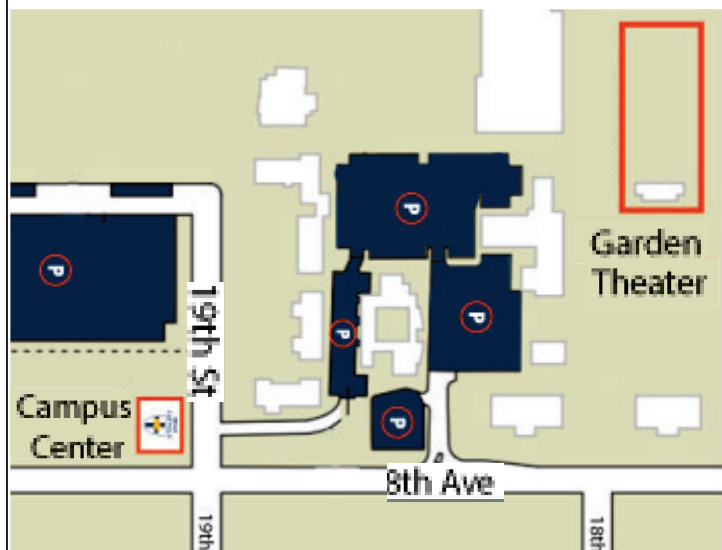
