Fr. Tomasz's Weekly Reflection

After the master of the house has arisen and locked the door, then will you stand outside knocking and saying, "Lord, open the door for us." The theme of a closed door is a commonly used motif in the Sacred Scripture. The concerning thing is the fact that the door is open for some, while for others is closed. After all, we're talking about the door to the Kingdom of God, where Jesus goes to prepare a place for us. If that was not enough, the exchange between the Lord and the people behind closed doors is also disturbing. They say: we ate and drank in your company and you taught in our streets, but Jesus response is an emphatic: I do not know where you are from. Depart from me, all you evildoers!


This is the key to understanding Jesus' message. Before God, where we come from is irrelevant: people will come from the east and the west and from the north and the south and will recline at table in the kingdom of God. They will come regardless of their origin, but with one thing in common - aversion to evil. Centuries earlier, the prophet Isaiah spoke of the same thing: They shall bring all your brothers and sisters from all the nations as an offering to the LORD. The offering to God made in clean vessels - by those who reject sin.

How do we get on Jesus' "short list" of those who will be able to get through the door? It is not enough just to know him, not enough to only choose not to do evil; more is needed. And this "more" Jesus points out by speaking about the narrow door. Behind this "more" there is a personal decision of each one of us, to do what is challenging, to stand by the truth, to be a sign of contradiction. Jesus shows two ways of being in the Church: Christians who think that there's nothing they should feel bad about because they belong to the Church, are baptized and have their children receive Sacraments, cultivate certain religious customs, etc. and juxtaposed Christians who really live their faith, trying to love their brothers and sisters, cooperating to the best of their ability to spread the Kingdom.
