Good stewards realize that if they embrace a humility that allows them to be generous to those who cannot repay them, they give evidence of having the kind of heart that will enjoy the Lord's intimate friendship. This week let's reflect on our attitude towards those who cannot repay our generosity. What is the extent of our hospitality toward others? Are we generous with those who cannot repay us?

Fr. Tomasz's Weekly Reflection

Taking the last places and inviting the least of the people is not in the spirit of this world. There is a difference between false and authentic humility. The first is a claim of pride that deliberately and demonstratively understates one's own value in front of others so that they respond with denying it. It is a mechanism aimed at extorting compliments and praise. Humbling oneself, on the other hand, is a trait of self-effacement that seeks the true measure of self. We need humility more than the fear of God, temperance, generosity, love, or even faith. It is because without humility, no virtue will hold. When St. Anthony had a vision of all the satanic snares that await a man striving towards God, he was terrified and asked God: "who can get through?" In response, he heard: "humility!" Humility is a power that no temptation and no evil spirit can break.

Humility does not begin with great sacrifices, but with the smallest steps. This is what Jesus says today: it is enough that you are not looking for the first place among other people; that you don't think you know everything; that in ordinary conversation you do not try to be original and infallible, boasting about your eloquence and erudition. One of the hallmarks of pride is standing out, manifested in presenting oneself as someone special, outstanding, and knowledgeable about everything. Not taking the first place does not only refer to looking for the last chair at common gatherings, but it also includes resigning from pressing one's own point of view and from striving to impress others. An unhealthy individualism is characterized by distinguishing oneself in statements, in clothes, in the way of being, even in the manner of prayer. But also playing the role of someone other than one really is.

This reminds me that Mary did not tell the servants of Cana of Galilee to do anything other than what Jesus told them to do: Do whatever he tells you. She didn't say: do whatever you like or, do more than what Jesus tells you. She made it very clear that they were to do only what Jesus said and nothing else. It is not coincidental, especially because the word Cana translates as "measure," We are limited beings who have to know our own measure, consider our own limitations. When we go beyond them or when we disregard them, we enter the area of claims to omnipotence. When that happens, we begin to constantly act out of arrogance, which makes itself felt even in the tendency to overinterpretation and excess, vanity and overload. We want to do more, be better, more perfect, more beautiful, smarter, more brilliant, unique, like no one else, wonderful... and eventually we no longer set out to do God's will, but rather our own will comes to the front, which easily gets us into the snares of an unrestrained ambition, taking us too high, like in the story of Icarus wings. And we know how this story ends...
