## Fr. Tomasz's Weekly Reflection

Something we need to emphasize more and more these days is the reality that the Church is not a community of lords but of servants. Even though we call Jesus the Lord, he *did not come to be served but to serve*. Therefore, the calling of everyone in the Church – the Mystical Body of Christ – is to serve, that is, to be with others, not just for others. The Lord Jesus says to his disciples today: *When you have done all you have been commanded, say, 'We are unprofitable servants; we have done what we were obliged to do.'* This is how our ministry is supposed to look.

A fundamental element of service – in building the community of the Church – is setting the hierarchy straight: putting God first. It isn't as easy as it may seem, because sometimes our own desires can masquerade as the will of God. We have to ask ourselves if we aren't simply convinced that we follow the light of truth, while in reality we only pursue the realization of our own plans. Many saints have experienced that, and many of them have desired some clarification. The very community of the Church can help, because God has established it also to act as a litmus paper, and to guide the individual members, to manage the deposit of faith, and to provide the answers to the questions that allow many to purify their quests.

The second element of service in creating the community of the Church is humility, which is the foundation of spiritual life. A humble person recognizes that God is everything and that all good comes from Him. I always liked the way St. Teresa of Avila illustrated the role of humility with an allegory of a game of chess. In order to win, one must first be able to arrange the pieces on the chessboard, and then skillfully maneuver them. Teresa then proceeds to point out the importance of the queen, while other pieces and pawns are intended to help her. Even though the queen is the most powerful piece, it also is an image of humility, as it relies on the skills and abilities of others. The humility in the context of our relationship with God is to accept that we are imperfect, yet that God loves us despite of it.

Finally, the third element of service is identifying those in need and helping them. We have many ways of doing this: Catholic Church runs places for the homeless, sick, single mothers, and also cold weather shelters and the places of care for those on the margins of society. But it's not enough just to send money and feel justified, explaining to ourselves that we are already helping, because the financial need is more likely than not somewhere down the list of the prioritized needs. This is where the recognition of God and humility allows us to go beyond just doing things for those in need. Because serving is about being with others. Serving is about restoring happiness, accepting the rejected, welcoming the homeless, attending to the sick and the suffering. The purpose of serving is to restore people's dignity and their self-worth. Serving is never about what, but always about who.

Christ the Servant can actually enter the life of the people of our generation and transform it. We only need to put Him first, recognize the truth about ourselves, and see those in whom He is present on a daily basis.


