

## Fr. Tomasz's Weekly Reflection

Prayer is like persistently knocking on the door. The heavens seem to be closed and deaf. But the truth is different. Heaven has long been open, only we are closed. Jesus has already opened it in his baptism, then in transfiguration, later in death and resurrection, finally in the ascension and in the sending of the Holy Spirit. God is ready to listen to us at any time. The point is, we sometimes don't feel like knocking, and hence the parable of a persistent widow is told to us by Luke, the evangelist. Let's say it even more radically: it is Jesus who knocks on our door in the well-known passage from the Book of Revelation, behold, I stand at the door and knock. If anyone hears my voice...

We are not only closed, locked down even, but also easily discouraged in prayer. Maybe we're hoping that our prayer will be saturated with deep emotions, while in reality it appears to be a senseless and unanswered uttering of words, or – even worse – boring reading from some prayer book. Sometimes God deprives us of the emotional response to our prayers, leaving us in a void and without a clear evidence of his favor, so that we may show our own faithfulness, rather than expecting it from him. Moses and Aaron were constantly before the Pharaoh, until finally one night he got up and let Israel out of Egypt. It was for them not only disappointing but also humbling to constantly experience the refusal of the king of Egypt, who neither feared God nor cared for the people. However, God continuously inspired Moses to knock on the gates of Pharaoh's palace, as He knew well that the Pharaoh would not let the chosen people go immediately. God took it as an opportunity for teaching Moses faithfulness to the divine motivations, by constantly demanding freedom for his people and not giving up until his will be done. It is good for us if we do not receive certain favors right away, because constant asking for them helps us grow in virtues of perseverance and faith, which is more valuable than receiving what we have asked for.

It's somewhat surprising that the words used in Jesus' parable are so harsh, even shocking. The judge decides to render a verdict favorable for the widow, explaining to himself this submission by fear of her reaction, *lest she finally come and strike me*. This phrase can be translated as *lest she hit me in the face*, or *lest she gives me a black eye*, which is a direct transcript from Greek, or – following the Latin text – *lest she scoffs at me*. I believe Jesus uses this expression to spiritually wake us up and show that the effectiveness of prayer is not wishy-washy, but to the points of gaining us a tremendous power. We need to remember however, that God is not making it difficult for us to obtain any grace. He teaches us that to *pray always without becoming weary* is sometimes more beneficial to us then receiving the graces we're asking for.




