There is an interesting twist we find in today's Gospel when we hear Jesus' parable of the Pharisee and the tax collector praying in the temple. The Pharisee is "praying to himself." The words of the Pharisee are very much centered on himself: he makes claims about his character. He highlights his own admirable activities. Good stewards of their prayer lives know that a prayer of praise and thanksgiving should focus on the goodness of God. Do your prayers of thanksgiving always stay focused on God's unfathomable, immeasurable goodness and generosity?


Fr. Tomasz's Weekly Reflection

In the parable included in today's Gospel passage Jesus presents before his disciples a story of two characters: the Pharisee and the tax collector. Both are sinners, but there is a significant difference between them. The Pharisee is a man who diligently takes care of his religious duties: fasting and almsgiving. As you can tell, there's something missing - the duty of prayer. He struggles with prayer, unable to look past his own "righteousness" and "perfection," and effectively unable to see God in prayer, as he spoke this prayer to himself. This reveals the hypocritical nature of the Pharisee. Hypocrisy is a manifestation of a lack of good will and by its nature closes the door to Christ, obscuring the truth about oneself. Thus, it prevents conversion. Jesus clearly criticizes such "facade piety," which instead of developing a relationship with God, focuses on one's own perfection. The Pharisee is an example of a man who becomes a collector of good deeds. What's more, he believes that this is enough for salvation.

The tax collector, on the other hand, aware of his own weakness and insufficiency, does not dare to point the finger, blame the other. He is aware that accusing others, even when it's reflecting reality, is only looking for excuses and will not gain him God's forgiveness. Forgiveness can only be obtained by making an examination of one's own conscience and showing contrition. This is a natural reaction of a heart dwelling under the influence of a working grace. Morally, both the tax collector and the Pharisee were sinners, however, only one was a sinner aware of his internal state. And this awareness made it possible to form in him the repentance of the heart, which is a condition necessary for obtaining God's forgiveness, because it is allowing God to act and to enter into one's life with a cleansing power. A heart contrite and humbled, O God, you will not spurn. The tax collector went home justified, because whoever exalts himself, will be humbled, and who humble himself will be exalted.

The coming of Jesus began a new chapter in the relationship between God and man. Jesus wanted to participate in the dramatic – affected by sin – dialogue of love between Creator and his creation. The presence of Jesus among us, as the Son of God and Man, was, is and will be a testimony of God's love for us, sinners. Jesus not only shows us how to abide by love, how to embrace with love both God and man, but He also makes love possible in the first place. In Him we experience that God loves us, and we are urged to reciprocate His love.

We are aware that a doctor cannot address an illness without a patient admitting it. God cannot forgive until man recognizes and reveals his sin. It's all because God gave us free will as an expression of his love. In our free will we may choose to sin, but out of that same will we are able to admit our faults and receive more of God's love offered in the form of forgiveness.
