Fr. Tomasz's Weekly Reflection

In today's Gospel ten lepers were cleansed, yet only to one of them Jesus said *your faith has saved you*. If one was saved, but the other nine were not, even though physically they have experienced the same healing, what is the difference? Nine of them went to show themselves to the priests, according to the Jewish ritual. Above all, they wanted to be free from the disease they were tormented by. There's nothing mentioned regarding their faith. It seems that even the miracle did not change anything in their spiritual lives. The Samaritan, on the other hand, *returned, glorifying God in a loud voice*. These words highlight his inner transformation – the transition from disbelief to total trust in God.

Similarly, in the first reading, Naaman declared his conversion from idolatry, and as a proof of his devotion to God, took with him *two mule-loads of earth* from the land where he was healed, in order to worship God back in his own native place. No miracle is as important to God as our dedication to God in faith, filled with boundless trust. The greatness and dignity of the believer lies precisely in the capacity to experience God by giving oneself entirely to Him, and accepting Him in return. This mutual giving and acceptance are based on the fact that God also believes in us, as Paul writes *He remains faithful, for He cannot deny himself*. To paraphrase it: I believe – that is, I trust – that God has faith in me.

It crossed my mind that the leprosy, which is mentioned in two of today's readings, somehow illustrates disbelief. Doing a little research, I found out that the Jews believed that leprosy was a kind of punishment for slander and insult. In the Book of Numbers, Miriam, Moses' sister, was struck with leprosy when she questioned his choice as the leader of the Chosen People, and slandered him *on the pretext of the Cushite woman he had married*. In essence, she doubted in God's choice. Doubt raised an accusation, which caused God's wrath, with a punishment being her to leprosy. To me it is an illustration of a life that is unable to fully trust God, and deflects its unbelief by casting accusations on others. Doubting God's love and goodness inevitably leads to destroying others' reputation with smear and defamation. Just like Naaman, as long as he remained leprous, disrespectfully doubted the sense of plunging into the waters of the Jordan, and his first reaction to the prophet's order was one of anger.

Our world has lost its faith in God, and so become leprous with the sheer vastness of slander, slur, libels, false accusations that echo every day in homes, on the streets, on internet forums, in messages shouted from social media platforms. In God's eyes, these are as hideous as a sight of a festering and rotting wound on a leper's body. After all, Christ's main work is justification, which stands in victorious opposition to Satan's shaming and accusation. Therefore, every time we are tempted to slander anyone, or even accuse, may it be for us a fair warning, a measure of our weakening faith, and let's think carefully about which side we will be on: Christ or Satan?
