

## Fr. Tomasz's Weekly Reflection

When a person is determined to get or achieve something, they will sacrifice a lot and are capable of many things in order to achieve it. Unfortunately, people who are less gritty most often fail to do so. Because wanting something and getting that something are two different things. This applies not only to material matters, but also to spiritual ones.

Our every petition, our every word directed to God is answered with patience and love. In fact, the Lord is waiting unwearyingly and incessantly for our word every day. For you love all things that are and loathe nothing that you have made; for what you hated, you would not have fashioned. Therefore, you rebuke offenders little by little, warn them and remind them of the sins they are committing, that they may abandon their wickedness and believe in you, O LORD! Meanwhile, we're impatient; we'd like to have everything right here and now.

And only by believing in God's love and goodness can we hope for fulfillment of our prayers, requests, and expectations. We ask you, brothers and sisters ... not to be shaken out of your minds suddenly, or to be alarmed either by a "spirit," or by an oral statement, or by a letter allegedly from us to the effect that the day of the Lord is at hand. In the same Letter, Saint Paul gives hope to the people of Thessalonica, and indirectly to us: We always pray for you, that our God may make you worthy of his calling and powerfully bring to fulfillment every good purpose and every effort of faith.

In the Gospel we hear about Zacchaeus, a wealthy publican who was seeking to see who Jesus was, wanting to make his dream come true. Zacchaeus was seeking to see who Jesus was – this statement is very important and applies to all of us, to every human being. The problem is also as relevant today as it was when Jesus walked through the towns and villages of his country. It presents a current issue for each of us personally: do we really want to see who Jesus is? Or maybe we are avoiding encountering Him; we don't want to come too close, lest He sees too much ... lest we have to accept all the truth that He is to reveal? Let us not allow ourselves to be intimidated; let us throw away any consideration of human opinion; let us not be worried about "what will people say."

Zacchaeus saw and was seen. This means that he fully encountered Christ, allowing Him to penetrate his heart, conscience, and his entire being. Conversion has come about because it is a fruit of seeing Jesus, of meeting Him in truth. This tax collector, whom the Pharisees considered a sinner irretrievably lost, was granted salvation. Not only that, but he accepted it, opening his home and heart to the Savior. Christ presents the same gift to every man. However, it requires a true grit and a desire to do our best to see Jesus.

Let us pray for courage, grit, desire, ambition, not to let ourselves be intimidated by the indifference to higher values, that our goal would be to see Jesus, our Savior, and to receive the fullness of redemption.
