A “Laser-Sharp” Focus on Christ

In today’s second reading we hear Saint Paul urging the members of the community at Thessalonica to direct their hearts to God’s love through Christ. He wants them to be laser-focused on Christ and nothing else. He desires that they be strengthened by the Lord and shielded from what is not Christ-like. Good stewards cultivate a “laser-sharp” focus on Christ; not on things that could give them false or superficial images or ideals. Let’s think about our own daily focus: Do we direct our hearts toward Christ or are there other “gods” that claim our attention? Our career? Material possessions? Sexuality? Favorite sports team? Political leanings? Does our daily life point to Christ so that those who are younger and less mature in their faith learn from our example?

Fr. Tomasz's Weekly Reflection

Most people imagine that, after death, our souls will jump out of their bodies, with some cry of relief, like: "Phew! Oof! Finally!" Many of us think of the eternal life as an unspecified state of some ethereal existence. But these images echo more of the Platonic than Biblical views. According to Plato, not an entire man, but only his soul would arise from death, emerging from the body as if from a tomb. However, every time when we recite the Creed we say: "I believe .. in the resurrection of the body."

The ancient Greeks believed in the afterlife lived in a world of a dreamlike Hades and the Elysian Fields inhabited by the souls of the good people. Everyone there however, lives like in some sort of an eschatological "waiting room," leading a life that is not fully resolved. Most of the Old-Testament Jews believed in the resurrection of the souls from the land of Sheol, at the end of times. Christians, on the other hand, were convinced from the very beginning that when we die, we immediately enter into a new relationship with God, which is expressed in the words from the Letter of St. Paul to the Corinthians: *For we know that if our earthly dwelling, a tent, should be destroyed, we have a building from God, a dwelling not made with hands, eternal in heaven.*

We know that God wants us to dwell with Him, but we do not understand what this dwelling will look like. Who will we be there? Souls? Ghosts? Energy? Will we keep some resemblance of our earthly selves? Will gender be a thing? And if so, why, if Jesus says we *will neither marry nor be given in marriage*? And if there's going to be any resemblance of our temporal bodies, from what moment of our lives? After all already here on earth our appearance changes every few years, sometimes so much that people who have not seen us for a few years have difficulty recognizing us, although we are the same people. And not only our bodies but also our spiritual and mental state experience drastic changes throughout our lives. So will we be the same and yet different?! Will we even recognize ourselves?! We don't know.

What we know, however, is that there is always something dying in us and something being risen, both on the material and spiritual levels. Therefore, we cannot imagine that the resurrection will only be the revival of the bodies, that the cemeteries will suddenly fill out with the un-dead. This vision seems grotesque and naive to me. The resurrection at the end of times will not only be a revival of old corpses, but a rise to a new quality of existence. Death and resurrection appear in the Bible as a dramatic but final leap towards an unchangeable reality, towards the reality of life totally united with God. Reality impossible to understand, yet so much desired.
