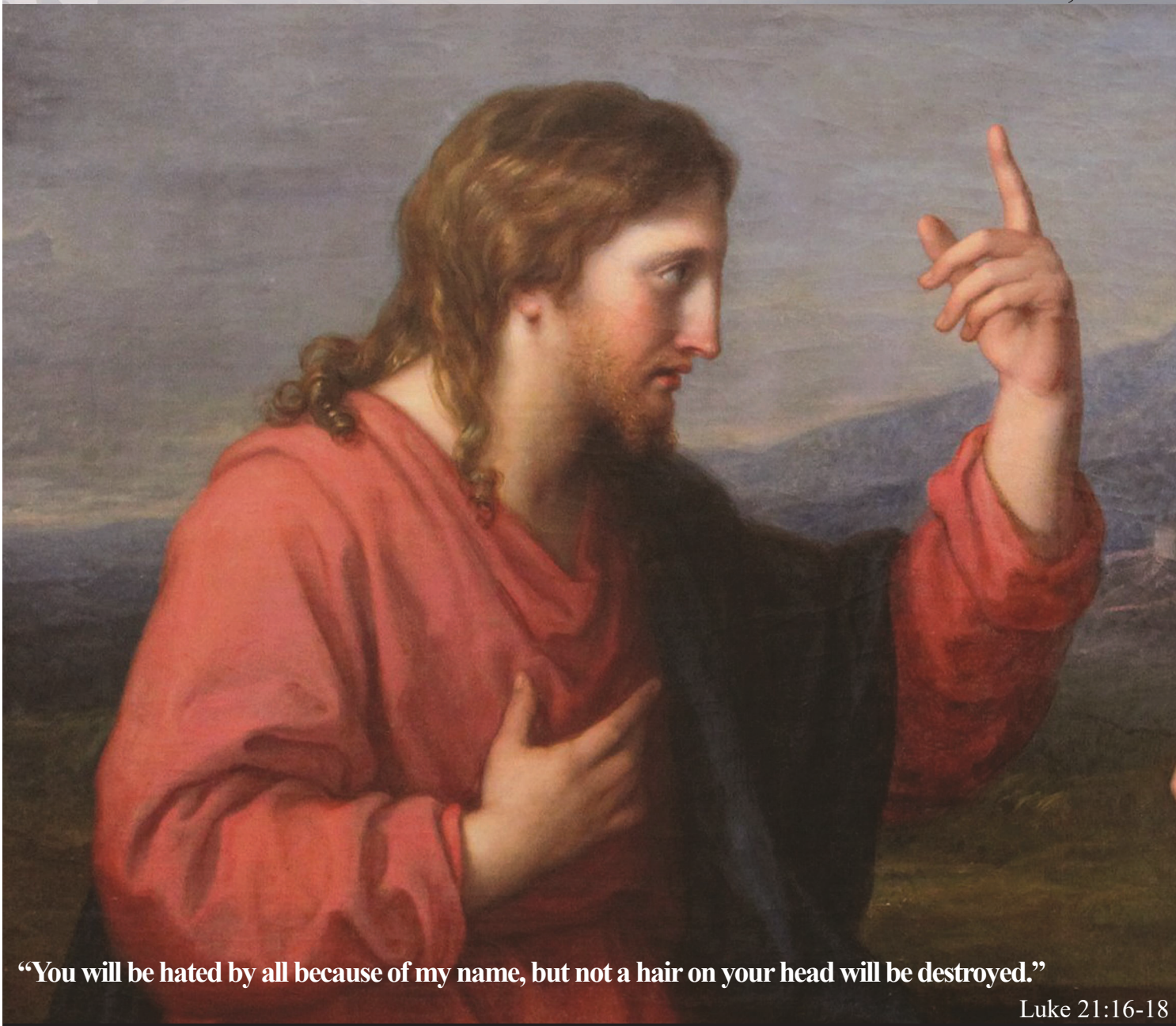

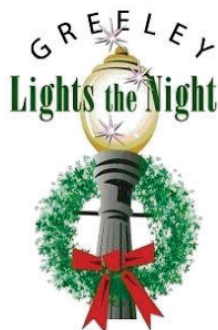
### Courage to Act in Jesus' Name

## Fr. Tomasz's Weekly Reflection

The temple building seemed to be impossible to destroy. For most people, the World Trade Center buildings in New York and the Pentagon in Washington, DC seemed impossible to destroy either; recently, not only for Ukrainians, but practically for the entire Western World, peace seemed impossible to destroy. But both the buildings and peace came to an end: days of fire like in a furnace, days full of smoke and destruction. Jesus gives several characteristic features that mark the end of subsequent eras: false Messiahs, wars, natural disasters, hunger, pandemic, abnormal atmospheric phenomena, and finally persecution, betrayal of loved ones. No one hopes to live in such circumstances, but maybe we are just experiencing that moment in the history of humankind?

Perseverance in faith is what will make the difference. First of all, these words of hope should remain in our memory: *not a hair on your head will be destroyed*. Our lives only make sense thanks to this promise of Christ. What's most important, perhaps this final time of our era has already begun, and we already belong to the eternal world more than to the temporal one. After all, Jesus said: *whoever hears my word and believes in the one who sent me has eternal life and will not come to condemnation, but has passed from death to life*. It is not written that one day will have eternal life, but that he already has it, as long as he listens and believes Jesus' words. Living in Christ is living in eternity already. The Jerusalem temple was destroyed and never rebuilt again, but the temple of Christ's Body was devastated on Good Friday, but on a third day, when it was still dark, Mary Magdalene saw it rebuilt again.

Christ's death was a real death in that it put an end to his earthly human existence. But because of the union which the person of the Son retained with his body, his was not a mortal corpse like others, for "it was not possible for death to hold him" and therefore "divine power preserved Christ's body from corruption." Both of these statements can be said of Christ: "He was cut off out of the land of the living", and "My flesh will dwell in hope. For you will not abandon my soul to Hades, nor let your Holy One see corruption." Jesus' Resurrection "on the third day" was the sign of this, also because bodily decay was held to begin on the fourth day after death. (CCC 627)

The disasters or persecution shouldn't come to the forefront of our lives, because they come and go; hope is the most important. However, faith in the world we hope for is not giving up on the one we live in. Whoever wants to live forever, should use every minute in this world to fill it with life with God.
