
Stewardship Corner

Fr. Tomasz's Weekly Reflection

Jesus Christ, hanging on the cross, grants universal amnesty to all humanity. Yes, not everyone knows about it and not everyone will want to take advantage of it. Its first recipient was an ordinary criminal who pleaded for paradise. In the moment of death his life was a hell, but it was a reflection of the hell he brought to others' lives. The author of the Gospel calls him κακοῦργος (Kakourgos) - a wrongdoer, a man who could only do evil. Josephus Flavius, a Jewish -Roman historian, uses the word wants, ληστής (Lestes), a robber, almost as to indicate that he robbed people of their safe heaven on earth. But Jesus Christ doesn't rob him, he gives him heaven, not just a small chance for heaven. The person who always took everything he wanted without asking, maybe for the first time asks, and receives, and only because he has asked for it with repentance. A true king can do anything, anywhere. It's no coincidence that Jesus was hung between two rebels, because in His kingship He is a true rebel, who came to disrupt the unjust world order, who started a rebellion against the oppression of others in the name of religion, progress, knowledge, politics, and wealth.

To equate the Son of God with the wicked has become a grace to lift all the wicked of all times to the heights of God's sonship. This is by no means an acceptance of human meanness, but a way to finally get out of it, towards the yet unimaginable level of existence. On the cross Jesus not only created but also crossed the bridge over the chasm that separates the hellish reality of death from the heavenly life of paradise. And this is not just a touching story from the past, because each of us is a wicked one and each of us dies on the cross of our own personal life. After all, none of us have escaped the grasp of original sin.

At the same time, this passage of the Gospel is a perfect image of two Sacraments of the Church: the Sacrament of Reconciliation, because it is the sacrament of reconciliation not only with God, but also with the consequences of one's faults, or in other words, the sacrament of resignation from rebellion against God. The criminal asks Jesus to remember him as if he were asking for absolution. He agrees to the cross, as his faults are now manifest. He has come to terms with the idea of his physical death, yet he has the courage to see his existence beyond it. The 'beyond' is the second Sacrament present here, the Sacrament of Eucharist, or the Sacrament of God's love. After reconciliation with God and oneself, He opens for us the gates of Paradise, which is nothing else than a Communion with Him. *Today you will be with me in Paradise* is not a promise for the end of times, but for today, because today we can be with Jesus in Communion.

We can get rid of the fear of death, but we cannot get rid of the death itself. Sometimes it may cause us to experience an extreme despair, or hell on earth, stemming from the certainty of our death and the perception of the inevitability of condemnation, because the weight of our sins prevents us from seeing anything worthy of love in ourselves. In some circumstances we might be in a process of slowly dying on the crosses of our sins, while all we need to do is ask Jesus for Paradise, kneel by the confessional, like a repentant criminal, and the Paradise will become available to us in the same moment. The Sacraments of God's Mercy and Love are inseparably connected. Let us never hesitate to ask Jesus for forgiveness, because Paradise can be ours today.
