On this first Sunday of Advent Jesus urges his disciples to stay awake and prepare themselves for the Lord's coming. Good stewards prepare themselves and await Christ's judgment in joyous expectation. This attitude requires genuine spiritual maturity, of course; the kind that is cultivated by prayer, participation in the sacraments, loving attention to family and one's communion of faith, and love for one's neighbor. Are we prepared for the Lord's second coming? Are we ready to receive Christ? Are we ready to look joyously for Christ's judgment?

Fr. Tomasz's Weekly Reflection

Sometimes in our lives we experience moments of unproductive looking into the past and examining the so-called "what ifs". We wonder what would happen if ... We usually form in our minds our own scenarios, more or less probable. The Gospel reminds us today: *if the master of the house had known the hour of night when the thief was coming, he would have stayed awake and not let his house be broken into*. Is the thief supposed to announce himself? After all, it's a part of his "profession" to acts by surprise. The host, on the other hand, must be vigilant not to be surprised.

Advent is no surprise. It is a clear and concrete call: Let us go rejoicing to the house of the Lord. These words of the Responsorial Psalm resound on the threshold of the four-week period, designated to prepare ourselves for the coming of the Emmanuel, God with us. We need to be prepared to receive God's love, and Advent is the time to embark on a journey towards our personal growth in charity.

But Jesus knows that the enemy does everything in his power to distract us on that journey. Because of that, He himself gives us specific instructions on how to make this time a fruitful one. First, He encourages us to abandon our carefree and thoughtless lives. One of the main enemies of charity is sloth, not understood only as a synonym to laziness, but rather as a laziness because of sorrow. Jesus shows us the example of people who, before the flood, lived their lives as if without much effort and commitment they would live forever, they lived in sloth. And that sloth has made them reject the objective goodness of God, who in clear and obvious signs called them to conversion. In sloth the enemy projects the objective good as something negative, which leads us to inaction, as we self-pity ourselves.

Another way the enemy prevents our growth in charity is by injecting in us the sin of envy. Today's concerns about worldly matters occupy us more than our eternal life. Our focus on our temporal life often leads us to a negativity towards other because of their possessions. Therefore, especially in Advent, those who love God must learn to balance the proportions between what is temporal and what is eternal. Today, God doesn't need us to build a wooden ark, but rather an ark of principles, ideas, good gestures and acts of mercy.

Finally, the advice to be vigilant in today's Gospel: be prepared, for at an hour you do not expect, the Son of Man will come, is a warning against the sin of pride. Pride that can make us think that we don't need to be ready for the coming of Christ. Pride is the reliance on our human strengths, while to be vigilant is to be aware that it is God who desires this encounter more than we, so that through this encounter we may gain what the human mind cannot comprehend and the human word cannot express. Watching means not focusing on ourselves, but rather on who we're waiting for.

It is important that we *know the time*, as St. Paul writes in the Letter to the Romans. This important time is called Advent, which is the period of vigilance, readiness, and attention. Let us be aware of the enemy's traps of sloth, envy and pride set up for us to fall into during this time, and may God's charity inspire us to act in the way we won't regret it later.
