# Fr. Tomasz's Weekly Reflection

In today's Gospel St. John the Baptist cries out in the desert, to prepare the way of the Lord, and to make straight his paths. This is a reiteration of Jesus' encouragement to stay awake. We are to do all we can to overcome the obstacles of sloth, presenting itself in the sinful pursuit of pleasure; pride, manifested in idolizing our own choices over God's will; and envy, experienced in an obsession with comparing to others. We need to do it in order to meet Jesus, not to sleep through the time of His coming.

St. John the Baptist, with his life and words, demonstrates how to prepare ourselves for the coming of the Lord: through penance, by overcoming our sinful tendencies, by rejecting the darkness and entering into the fullness of the light of Christ's saving grace. God constantly comes out to meet us and to give us Himself. He wants us to receive Him, so that we can become more like Him. Advent, as the beginning of the Liturgical Year, is a good time for that spiritual quest. John encourages us to abandon the comfortable apathy of laziness, indifference and mediocrity, and to put on the shoes of an active wanderer, a pilgrim, a person with a clearly defined goal in life, and to set off on a journey that leads through the desert of conversion to the green pastures of heaven. It is important to make this continuous effort to convert, because it is not enough to just hear the voice of the prophet, but one must also consciously and intentionally respond to it.

If we want to prepare the way for the Lord, we must truly believe in God's power. And to truly believe is to entrust ourselves to Him along with everything that constitutes our everyday life, our individual vocations, the world in which we live and work. If we want to truly believe, and not just think piously about Jesus from time to time, we have to integrate true faith in Christ with our lives.

To have true faith is to open ourselves to the realization that Jesus is not coming to us because we are already perfectly prepared for Him, without sin, living in perfect harmony and love. We need to strive for it, but the time when the wolf shall be a guest of the lamb, and the leopard shall lie down with the kid; the calf and the young lion shall browse together, with a little child to guide them is not here yet. To have true faith is to understand that it's the coming of the Messiah that will bring the opportunity to reconcile not only with God, but also with others. This is one of the most important effects of the manifestation of the Son of God among us.

The Love of God for men creates the platform for understanding above sociological, temporal, and historical divisions and introduces the bond of reconciliation. The full experience of the Church is not when people are united by mutual appreciation, but rather when, despite their differences, they are able to pray to the same God. The Church is not a romanticized community of flatterers and complimenters, but a Communion with God, which is experienced in simple acts of charity, motivated only by the knowledge of being loved, and the desire to share this love.

Prepare the way of the Lord means to open ourselves to be transformed by the Love of God, and to act on this Love towards others.

### The Call to Conversion

In today's Gospel reading John the Baptist warns his listeners: "Repent, for the Kingdom of Heaven is at hand!" The Church's yearly Advent herald is a call to repentance. The season of Advent urges us to be open to a conversion of heart. Christian stewards heed this call daily, and take the need for conversion in their lives seriously. As a family of faith, do we hear this call to conversion amidst the massive holiday spending? The increase in credit card debt? The urge to buy things that are not necessary? The incivility on the roadways during the holidays? Are there patterns in our own lives that need to be converted?
