Fr. Tomasz's Weekly Reflection

Two words are important to us today – joy and conversion. Today these two words have a special meaning, because the 3rd Sunday of Advent, called Gaudete – Sunday of Joy (and for the symbol of joy today's liturgical color is rose), refers us to the joy of waiting, expecting the coming of the Emmanuel. In order to experience this expectation in a joyful manner we have to first experience a conversion.

The call to conversion should not be perceived as a lesson or a warning, but rather as our invitation and openness to hearing the words, watching the gestures and experiencing the deeds of Christ, who leads us to himself, to his loving heart, to the heart that teaches us to overcome division by the most perfect love. This openness signifies our trust in God, because as we read in the first reading, then will the eyes of the blind be opened, the ears of the deaf be cleared; then will the lame leap like a stag, then the tongue of the mute will sing, and therefore the joy comes not from what has already happened, but rather from what will happen, what we expect, what we desire.

How to prepare for God's coming, how to convert? Saint James in his letter gives us this advice: You too must be patient. Make your hearts firm, because the coming of the Lord is at hand. Each of us will interpret these words slightly differently, in our own way, just as each of us will look for our own example of conduct, one that works for ourselves. James suggests: Take as an example of hardship and patience, brothers and sisters, the prophets who spoke in the name of the Lord. So let's ask ourselves a few questions: Who is God really for my thoughts, for my heart, for all my life and actions? As a follower of Christ, do I not only believe in Him, but also trust in Him? Do I tell others about Him? Do I bear witness to Him in the family, work, school?

The disciples of John the Baptist asked Jesus himself, are you the one who is to come, or should we look for another? They acted like those who seek enlightenment first in prayer, and only then in books and other documents. I think on the contrary, most of us ask theologians, historians, priests, catechists, or even professors of Catholic universities about who Jesus is or was. We forget that, like the disciples of John the Baptist, we should ask the Lord Jesus Himself: ask this question in prayer, during Holy Mass, after receiving the Holy Communion. If the Lord Jesus had said to John's disciples: I am the Messiah, it would have caused a misunderstanding, because of the expectations towards the Messiah that the Jews had. And if he said: I am God, it would have caused a cognitive dissonance, because no one has ever seen God. Jesus' answer was different. It meant: you will get to know me when you will see what I do. This is an important tip for us. Theological statements and catechism definitions are important, but we will get to know Jesus best when, amongst the noise of this world, we will see what He has done and continues to do for us, for people. The ability to discover the true Jesus, his love for us and not just a dictionary definition, is what brings us true and full

Much has been done in the history, and is still being done, to surround Christ with a shroud of conspiracy of silence, to deny his existence and mission, or at least to diminish and distort it. Therefore, this question that John's disciples asked only once, we should ask and answer ourselves many times, again and again. The answer will bring us more joy each time we ask, because each time it will remind us how much God loves us. Therefore let us convert our hearts to the love with which God has loved us, so that God's joy may be in us and our joy may be complete.
