

Fr. Tomasz's Weekly Reflection

The celebration of Christmas makes us meditate on how the Invisible God has become visible: God in Heaven has become Emmanuel, God with us. The earth has seen its Savior, because the Word was made flesh and dwelt among us. This moment in history is called the fullness of time, the key to understanding our lives. Christ – the Incarnate Word – is God's final answer to man's deepest and most fundamental desire of being loved. He is the fulfillment of all our needs, the answer to all our questions, religious and moral. The Son of God comes to reveal himself to us and show us the way to the Father.

For God so loved the world that He gave his only son, who became one of us. He came to save his people from their sins. What high dignity the Lord God has raised us to. He created us and shaped us – according to the flesh – in the image of his beloved Son and – according to the spirit – in the likeness of the Holy Ghost. In the light of this truth, Christmas is significant not only because it is a time of hope and tenderness, a time of peace and joy, a time of love and family, but most of all, because it is a time of encounter with God who has always looked for his people, guided and guarded them, promised that He would always be with them.

Christmas, the most beautiful family holiday, means nothing if we don't invite and encounter to our lives Jesus - Love Incarnate. We are invoking God in Christmas carols, in the cards we send, in our attendance at the Eucharist, but we need to make sure it doesn't end, like in Bethlehem, with many people closing the door before the Holy Family for their peace of mind. Bethlehem connects heaven and earth, but also brings God among people. If we confine our encounter with God only to the time when we pray, the time when we receive Sacraments or the time when we read the Scripture, but won't let him in to our homes, to our everyday lives, to our work places, to our schools, to our public life, we won't be able to look at each other with eyes filled with love. And in this way, we will not become true witnesses of a God's Love for us. unlike the shepherds, who returned to their flocks from Bethlehem glorifying and praising God for all they had heard and seen.

We too come today to Bethlehem, to Christ. But when we leave to return back to our lives, the encounter with God among us needs to continue, in our work, in our duties and responsibilities, in wherever God sends us together with His grace and blessing. If our encounter with the Emmanuel is genuine, it will make us start spreading the Good News with love and conviction. The encounter with the living Christ obliges us to this and relies on us. He surrendered to the laws of human life, surrendered to the laws of suffering, in order to be closer to us, more understandable, so that our life and our suffering would find their meaning.

Looking at Baby Jesus laying in a manger let us rejoice and worship God with all our hearts, because He wanted to live among us. But let us not leave Him in the church, but take Him home.
