Fr. Tomasz's Weekly Reflection

The beginning is not everything, but a lot depends on the beginning. Like in sports, getting of the line as fast as possible, making a good first step out of the starting penalty shootout. blocks, scoring the first goal in the The first action, the first impression can often affect the end result: victory or defeat. Something similar happens in the spiritual life. When we start without God, we are already missing something. However, when we trust Him from the beginning, we can be sure that He will guide us. This happens at the beginning of each calendar year. In the past the New Year's Day was celebrated as the feast of the Jesus' Circumcision, because on the eighth day after His birth Jesus was circumcised and given the name that the angel called Him at the Annunciation.

In the modern tradition we celebrate today the Solemnity of Mary Mother of God or Theotokos – the One who, in the fullness of time, gave birth to the Incarnate Word of God. Mary is the beginning of redemption, but she is also the guide through every moment of our lives. On this day Church reminds us that Mary has the greater influence on us, the more we desire her intercession. It is therefore important that at the beginning of the year we entrust our lives under her maternal protection. She, our Mother, desires nothing more than that God blesses us and pours out His mercy on us constantly.

At the beginning of the year, many of us ask ourselves: what will the new year be like? What will happen in our lives, in the world? This question is difficult to answer fully. There will be many events that do not depend on us, which we have no influence on, which we cannot plan. But there will also be events that we can influence, by our honesty, sincerity, faithfulness or generosity. This New Year can be a boring copy of the previous year, or it may also be truly new. It may be filled with going through the motions or it can be bursting with our responsibility and active presence. It could be a year to forget, or a year that will leave a mark.

But what will this year be like? We don't know. What we know however, is that today, on the first day of the year, we honor Mary, the Mother of God. We honor the beginning of God's plan. Mary wants to accompany us on the paths of this new year. She wants to walk with us, or perhaps at times to precede us on our journey. Entering the new year, let us take with us this image of Mary, the Mother of God, leaning over the Child, contemplating and pondering the mystery of the Word – the mystery of God. May this image accompany our lives, may it bring us peace and hope.
