

# Fr. Tomasz's Weekly Reflection

Today Church celebrates the Epiphany, that is, the day of the revelation of Jesus to the world. This revelation is done by the signs that are being interpreted by various people. The peoples of the whole world, of all languages and countries are represented in the persons of The Magi, who, called by the Lord and by following the star, set out to recognize the Newborn King in Bethlehem. The Priests and the Scribes, on the contrary, being geographically near the grotto where Jesus was born, not only do not take a single step towards it, but even more so – are completely oblivious to the events that are taking place in Bethlehem, literally around the corner from where they reside (Bethlehem is only about 6 miles away from Jerusalem). The wise men are guided by a star that from a long distance, it encourages them and illuminates the way.

Priests and Scribes knew the words of the prophecies well. Thus, they correctly interpreted where the birthplace of the King of Israel was supposed to be. But they couldn't tell Herod anything more than mere interpretative information. Therefore, we are dealing with a kind of a paradox. On one hand, we see a mysterious star that guides the path of the three pagans, leading them to the encounter with the Savior. On the other hand, we have the Scripture, the actual Word of God, read and taught by the Priests of the Old Covenant in such a way that Herod cannot be given anything but vague information, bringing fear rather than encouraging him.

The Magi came to Bethlehem because they obediently allowed themselves to be guided by the star. It is not to say that the Scripture has no value or is less important, but rather to point out how important it is to learn to observe in our everyday life the signs through which God speaks to us, calls us and directs us. Scripture is one of these signs.


Speaking about signs, the wise men brought symbolic gifts to Jesus: gold, frankincense and myrrh. Gold signified what is beautiful, glorious and valuable. It indicated the dignity of Jesus as king. Incense was used in temples during sacrifices as a symbol of prayer raising up to God. It meant that Jesus is God. Myrrh is a balm that was used to anoint the dead, and when added to wine, it strengthened it. Such a drink was given to convicts. It is a foreshadowing of the Passion of the Lord and His burial.

There is one last sign present in today's Gospel: The Magi, after meeting Jesus, *departed for their country by* another way. Such a re-routing can mean the conversion to which those who encounter Christ are called, in order to become the true worshipers He desires. Taking *another way* entails imitating Jesus' way of acting, making of oneself a living sacrifice, holy and acceptable to God.
