Fr. Tomasz's Weekly Reflection

During the Holy Mass, just before receiving the Eucharist, Mother Church leads in prayer: *Ecce Agnus Dei, qui tollit peccata mundi* - This is the Lamb of God who takes away the sins of the world. The Latin word *tollo* (*tolerō, tulī, lātus*) used there, means not so much to take away but rather to endure or to bear with great difficulty – hence the well-known English term *tolerance*, meaning bearing something or someone with a significant struggle. The Lamb of God takes away the sins of the world by taking them upon himself, lifting them up, enduring, bearing them – tolerating – not in the sense of giving an indifferent consent, but rather patiently enduring the burden of these iniquities. And if Jesus bears our sins, shouldn't we have the courage and determination to bear someone else's sins against us? Or even more so someone's defects, faults, mistakes, weaknesses?

I sometimes wonder why the particular sins come back to me, humiliating me, even though I have confessed them sincerely in the past. I think it is because I am still unable to bear the sins of others. If I am not ready or willing to bear others' flaws – that is, I don't *take away* someone's sins, then how can I expect Jesus to bear with my sins? If I am to truly allow Jesus to bear my vices, I need to prepare myself for bearing the iniquities of others. Jesus, bearing with me as a sinner, takes away my sins. Likewise, by bearing with another sinner, I contribute to the remission of these sins.

On the other hand, when we get indignant and pretentiously judge our neighbors, when we say that we 'can't take it anymore', our old sins may return – our addictions, our unclean deeds, our compulsions. The more focused we are on our own sins, the less interested we are in the sins of others and the more power we have to bear them. But we easily forget that we are a sinful generation, and we judge, assign faults, have no tolerance and hate each other. Meanwhile, it is better to be rebuked and judged than to be judgmental and reproving. For even when someone unjustly judges and scolds us – if we endure it and forgive – we will be rewarded not only in the acquired virtue of patience but also with the strength to endure others' judgments.

We read in the book of Proverbs 9:8: *Do not reprove the arrogant, lest they hate you; reprove the wise, and they will love you.* Do we love those who scold us? If yes, then we are wise, if not, there's only one other option.

A man with a heart ready to endure or bear someone else's sins, will see exaltation and turn even enemies into friends. Using the words of the late Pope Benedict XVI, "The world offers you comfort, you were not made for comfort, but for greatness." The community of the Church here on earth is not to seek comfort, but to learn the uncomfortable virtue of bearing the sins of others and pleading with God for them.
