Fr. Tomasz's Weekly Reflection

Last Sunday, in my homily, I mentioned that one of the reasons for the Lamb of God to come to the world is to give our lives meaning. In today's Gospel passage Peter, Andrew, James and John are working with their nets, are doing things they have done before hundreds of times, casting their nets or mending them, but one thing that strikes me is that this scene, in the way it's described, feels lifeless, hopeless, almost desperate: they've been doing this their entire lives, day after day and night after night, with little benefit from it, little satisfaction. When Jesus appeared on the shore of the lake, He gave their lives a new perspective, a meaning, and they were captivated. Only God can give a new meaning to man's existence. Only God makes life thrilling and fascinating, worthy of abandoning immediately everything that we know.

It is because of Jesus, thanks to him coming to us while we are entangled in our nets, that life can be fulfilled even in the most mundane form, but He still is about something more. He wants to do something greater for us. He desires to catch for us the eternity from beneath the surface of the temporal life, or to pull to the shore those drowned in the sea of sins, to give them a new life. In this short fishing episode, we see how great God is in Jesus Christ. He revealed to those four a new dimension of life, helped them to see something infinitely more beautiful than seaweed, fish fins, net ropes and sweat of their physical work. He helped them take their aspirations higher. From the seabed to the unfathomable sky.

There are thousands of people around us who cannot cope with life, see no prospects, much less hope in God. Entangled in the web of helplessness and senselessness, they lean towards despair and self-condemnation. They are like fish caught in a net – caught in the snares of taxes, computer networks, chain stores, addictions, toxic emotions, childhood wounds, debts, and finally the web of sins. Who will lift them up?

Jesus called four disciples at once because we need each other and it happens that when we support others, we help ourselves. But in order not to entangle others, we must be set free by Jesus himself. That is why Jesus first freed Peter, Andrew, James and John from their own nets, and then told them to go and catch others to a new life in the Spirit. The meaning of our own lives is measured by our ability to take others out of their entanglement. It's worth living knowing that you helped someone bounce off the bottom. Here is a carpenter from Nazareth who, in a few words, helped poor fishermen to get out of their tangled fate and made them leaders of the people, but above all gave them a promise of eternal life. He did not say: follow me to help me become a great religious leader, but he said: follow me and I will make you leaders who are to create a refuge for the fearful.

The Church that Jesus established, till this day, is the reality of patient perseverance of lifting others up above oneself. Jesus taught his first disciples leadership, which is not about manipulating others, but serving others to lift them up. Higher than oneself. This is the meaning of life, the meaning of leadership. Many people pull up the ladder after reaching the top of their careers. Christ shows us something completely different. Not only pull others from the bottom, but put them above on the journey to heaven.


